What matters to you

From data collated from local surveys, beat knowledge, intelligence and reports made to Leicestershire Police, the following have been highlighted as priorities within the community.

Priority 1: Drugs.

You said: Drug use and supply is ongoing in the Saffron Lane Estate and in other areas of the community.

We did: A property being used to cultivate cannabis was recently discovered by police on Lothair Road, a report was made that the address was being cleared by a group, police attended and arrests were made. Inside there was clear evidence that the address was being used as a grow with enquires on going to identify others involved.

Priority 2: Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) in open spaces.

You said: ASB in open spaces is still occurring in parks, play areas and other areas.

We did: Patrols in open space areas continues especially as the lighter evenings draw in and sadly there has been an increase in report of ASB in the community. Recently a group were stopped and searched after a report was made of youths causing issues in the Meadow Gardens area, all were issued warnings and returned home.

Priority 3: Vehicle Crime.

You said: That vehicle crime has increased in the community.

We did: Again, we are very happy to report that theft of and from vehicles has reduced with no new reports in the last month. A stolen vehicle was recently discovered in the Wordsworth Road area and enquires are ongoing to determine how it got there and to return it to its rightful owner.

Sadly, there has been a recent increase in bicycle thefts particularly in the Knighton Lane East area, local officers, the Safer Winter Streets team and other South Leicester area officers have been made aware and patrols in these areas are in place. If you are leaving your bicycle unattended then please consider robust security measures such as locks, leaving your cycle in well light areas and using Bike Register.
