What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will prioritise the following from June 2025.

Priority 1: Rise in Drug Dealing and Drug Use. What we are going to do: From June we are still seeing drugs are drug dealing as being one of the major issues for the beat team. We aim to tackle this by disrupting drug lines by executing drug warrants on addresses that are known to us. The beat team and other surrounding beats will continue to submit intel for individuals we suspect to be involved with drugs and drug dealing. High visibility patrols will also be conducted to disperse any drug dealing taking place.

Priority 2: Speeding. What we are going to do: Speeding still continues to be a beat team problem. We will continue to organise speeding ops where we will be accompanied by PC 1548 Taylor to conduct these speeding ops to be able to give out the reasonable consequences for anyone that is caught driving in excess of the speed limit. Now the children have broken up from school please be more mindful that they will be out playing possibly near roads. Speeding has been brought to our attention in all beat surgeries, so we will continue to monitor the issue.

Priority 3: Anti-Social Behaviour. What we are going to do: We as a beat team have had multiple reports of youths hanging around abandoned buildings especially since the schools have broken up. Please encourage youths in and around the area to use youth appropriate places to hang out, for example the park or youth groups. Abandoned buildings are not places to hang around as they are dangerous and unstable. We will continue to patrol these buildings on late shifts especially but on early shifts as well. Those who are caught causing Anti-social behaviour will be dealt with accordingly.

PC 1548 has been delivering closure orders on the beat as well as giving out section 59s for vehicles being used in Anti-social behaviour (ASB). He continues to help with patrols on the Sileby memorial park in relation to ASB with bikes and has helped save a puppy from a violent individual! The puppy is now safe and well, I'm sure you'll all be glad to know.

PCSO 6031 Charlie has been busy conducting beat surgeries, keeping her crime allocations down and engaging with members of the public. She continues to patrol in marked vehicles as well as foot patrols in hotspots on the beat. These include The Poppyfields estate Barrow upon soar, Mill lane Sileby and The Memorial Park Sileby.

PCSO 6938 Kelly has conducted beat surgeries in Barrow Library and Seagrave Memorial Hall. Patrols in different areas of the beat including Wymeswold, Seagrave and the Wolds have been patrolled in marked vehicles as well as on foot.
