We did - We're Taking Action on Road Safety - We've been working with partner agencies and listening to your concerns to tackle road safety and anti-social behaviour in Rushey Mead. You will see

- Beat officers are patrolling schools during pick-up and drop-off times to keep everyone safe.
- Speed checks and vehicle operations are planned across the area—watch out for us!
- We're cracking down on nuisance motorbikes and ASB in green spaces, with warning signs going up around the beat.
- Joint efforts with the council have already helped improve parking issues near local schools.

We Did -We're Taking Action on ASB - This is being tackled by the beat team through bespoke created OP Wasp. You will see –

- Local officers are regularly patrolling green spaces to tackle anti-social behaviour (ASB).
- Focus areas include Rushey Fields, Appleton Park, and Jessie Jackson Park.
- Working with the council, residents, and community groups to improve safety and cleanliness.
- Taking positive action to keep parks safe and enjoyable for everyone.
- Officers are carrying out both high-visibility and plain-clothed patrols in ASB hotspots.

We did — we're Taking action on Drug Dealing/Drug Taking - You will see

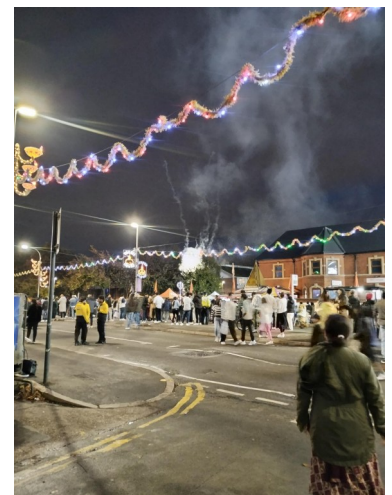
- Working with partner agencies to gather intelligence and support enforcement.
- Post-enforcement, we collaborate with housing providers to prevent repeat issues, including securing evictions when necessary.
- Targeting drug dealing and misuse through arrests and prosecutions.
- Using community intel and partnerships to address key concerns.
- Supporting those affected by drug misuse by connecting them with treatment and rehab services.
