This presents a number of health and safety issues and staff were concerned about the possibility of a serious incident occurring. Officers have patrolled the site at various times out of hours, their visibility deterring would be visitors.

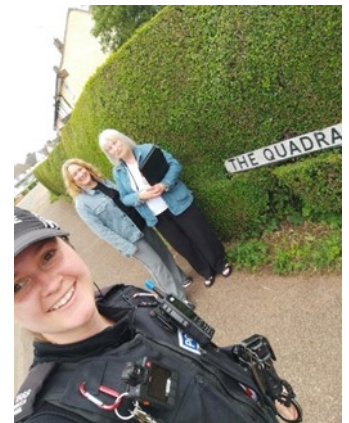


Officers responded to a request from Uppingham Community College to engage with youngsters. As a direct result of this request officers ran an Anti Social Behaviour engagement session with students of the college. It was very well received and gave our officers the opportunity to explain about ASB and the issues it causes.

Issues around Cutts Close

PCSO Lauren Lyall was out on patrol recently and after reports of ASB in the area made a point of patrolling there. PCSO Lyall engaged with a large group of youngsters explaining about the impact that anti social behaviour has on the community and how it affects people in and around Cutts Close. PCSO Lyall also patrolled the hospital grounds ensuring there were no issues there. All was quiet when PCSO Lyall patrolled.

PC Rebecca Angel had received reports about anti social behaviour on the Quadrant in Uppingham. In conjunction with staff from Rutland Community Safety and Longhurst Housing they toured the area and spoke with several residents to gather information about the anti social behaviour and drug dealing. Gathering this information enables PC Angel and council and housing staff to tackle the issues in a targeted way.
