#YouSaid - What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and the following:

Your Concern:

We understand that **drug use, drug dealing**, and the associated criminal activity are causing significant concern within the community.

Our Response:

We are committed to addressing these issues by working closely with local residents, partner agencies, and community organisations to gather information, target offenders, and provide appropriate support where needed. Your safety and confidence remain our priority, and we will continue to take proactive steps to reduce harm and improve the quality of life for everyone in the area.

Your Concern: **Anti-social behaviour** is a major concern for many residents on the beat.

Our Response: We are committed to identifying those responsible and addressing their behaviour through the Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) incremental approach. This ensures proportionate and consistent action is taken, with the aim of reducing harm and improving community safety.

Your Concern: **Speeding and road safety** across the beat have been highlighted as key concerns by members of the community.

Our Response: With the Road Safety Partnership, the speed enforcement vehicle continues to be utilised to priority locations across the beat. This targeted approach aims to deter speeding, improve driver behaviour, and enhance overall road safety for all road users.

#WeDid - What we are doing

Neighbourhood Policing Update- It's been a busy few weeks for your local neighbourhood team, with officers and PCSOs working across Melton and the surrounding villages to support residents, **tackle local concerns**, and keep our communities **safe**.

Neighbourhood Issues & Community Engagement -We have attended and helped resolve **several neighbour disputes**, working with all parties involved to find **positive outcomes** and provide reassurance. We have also continued to work closely with housing associations, Melton Borough Council, and the Safer Communities Team to address ongoing concerns relating to **nuisance behaviour and noise complaints**.

Patrols & Proactive Policing High-visibility patrols have continued across our beats, including reassurance patrols in local villages and targeted patrols in areas experiencing anti-social behaviour, **motorbike nuisance**, and concerns around **driving standards**. Joint patrols have also been carried out to tackle reports of inconsiderate driving and respond to community concerns.



#WeDid—What we are doing continued



Road Safety

Road safety continues to be a **key focus** for the neighbourhood team. During proactive patrols and vehicle checks, officers identified a vehicle being driven without valid insurance, road tax, or an MOT. Following enquiries, the vehicle was stopped safely and the driver spoken to regarding the offences. A **Traffic Offence Report** was issued, and due to the lack of valid insurance, the **vehicle was seized** under police powers and removed to a secure compound. We will continue carrying out patrols and enforcement activity to improve road safety and deter those who choose to use our roads unlawfully.

Supporting Vulnerable People

Protecting vulnerable members of our community remains one of our **highest priorities**. Officers have carried out safeguarding visits following concerns about potential exploitation and vulnerability, working closely with partner agencies to provide support where needed. This includes ongoing work to identify and prevent **cuckooing**, where **criminals exploit vulnerable individuals** by taking over their homes and using them for **illegal activities such as drug dealing**. These cases can often be hidden from public view, making community information and partnership working vital in safeguarding victims and disrupting offenders.

Operational Support

Neighbourhood officers have continued to support colleagues across the **wider force area**, demonstrating the flexibility of local policing. This has included assisting with **arrests, transporting prisoners safely into custody, attending domestic-related incidents**, and helping response officers manage demand during busy periods.

Officers also assisted with scene preservation following the **fire at Thurmaston Shopping Centre**, helping to maintain a secure scene and **protect potential evidence** while specialist enquiries continued. Supporting major incidents and operational deployments ensures that investigations can progress effectively and communities remain safe.

Investigations & Enquiries

Alongside visible patrols, a significant amount of work takes place behind the scenes to support investigations and victims of crime. Officers have been recording **crime reports, taking statements, gathering evidence, visiting victims and suspects, and progressing ongoing enquiries**.

The team has also spent time completing **essential** administrative work, including preparing case files, updating investigations, and liaising with partner agencies. While much of this work happens away from public view, it is crucial in ensuring **investigations are thorough**, victims are supported, and offenders are brought to justice.

Positive Results

Proactive policing continues to deliver positive results across the area. During a stop and search in the Knipton area, officers located suspected **Class A drugs**, resulting in the **arrest of two males** who were taken into custody. Enquiries remain ongoing.

Community Events & Reassurance Patrols

Officers have supported local events and carried out reassurance patrols across the area, including around the **Forbidden Forest event**. These patrols provide a visible presence, help address community concerns, and offer opportunities to engage with residents.

Tackling Anti-Social Behaviour

Anti-social behaviour remains a priority for the neighbourhood team. Officers have conducted targeted patrols in areas affected by **nuisance behaviour**, including reports involving **off-road motorbikes**. We continue to work with partner agencies, **gather intelligence**, and take action where possible to address concerns raised by the community.

In addition, officers attended a **Joint Action Group (JAG) meeting**, working alongside partner agencies to discuss ongoing concerns and ensure coordinated plans are in place to address wider community issues.

□ **Safeguarding & Welfare**

Officers responded to **mental health-related welfare concerns**, including submitting a **safeguarding report** with the individual's consent.

□ **Station Duties**

- The team also supported the **front enquiry office**, handling a wide range of public enquiries including criminal reports, intelligence sharing, and general queries.

- We continue to deal with local issues such as Anti-social behaviour and safeguard vulnerable residents and cuckooing victims as and when we identify concerns.
- Our work is ongoing with local schools including engagement events.
- And lastly as 'Dedicated Neighbourhood Officers' we continue to work on and try find solutions with neighbour disputes. We also support our response colleagues and cover the front enquiry office too.
