### What matters to you

#### • Priority 1: Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) in derelict buildings

You said: There was groups of youths hanging around and climbing on derelict buildings, playing loud music and being abusive to nearby residents.

We did: We conducted extra patrols to deter the youths from entering the derelict buildings, any youths we came across we gave words of advice to explain how dangerous these properties can be. We worked with the council and the owners of the properties to make the areas safer.

#### • Priority 2: Burglaries

You said: That your neighbourhood has seen an increase in burglary.

We did: We have been on the beat posting leaflets to educate local residents about keeping your home safe and secure now darker nights are drawing in. We will continue to conducts high visible patrols and maintain a strong policing presence in the community, we will also be holding beat engagements for crime prevention tips.

#### • Priority 3: Vehicle crime

You said; There was an increase in vehicle crime in the area.

We did: We increased patrols of an evening, working with the officers on the later shifts, Working towards reducing the opportunities for theft from motor vehicles.
