Road Safety issues have been a regular issue for the Greater Hinckley area with vehicles being parked illegally/inconveniently. We have also seen road rage incidents causing RTC and disruption within the local traffic. Driving without insurance Drug/Drink driving	See page 2
We are seeing constant reports of drug issues in the Greater Hinckley area due to the longer nights such as, Drug use in public areas Drug dealing in certain areas	Our Neighbourhood Priority Team are actively seeking and developing intelligence in relation to properties within our Beat in order to obtain Warrants.
We have seen a slight increase in ASB on the beat over the past couple of months due to the hotter and nicer weather through the summer. ASB incidents such as: Vehicle nuisance or inappropriate use on parks and nearby roads. Rowdy or inconsiderate behaviour from youths. Littering or drugs paraphernalia.	We have received calls in relation to some ASB on the Clarendon Park Car Park. A large group of youths have been reportedly screaming, shouting and causing general ASB up until 2am. Our beat team are now managing this on our antisocial behaviour system where a plan to target this is underway.

'Did somebody say just seized'

Driving at speed down Normandy Way then cutting lanes at the roundabout is never going to end well, especially if you're here on 'holiday' in a non-UK registered vehicle, doing cash in hand deliveries on someone else's account for a well known fast food delivery company. The Vienna Convention on Road Traffic explains about how/when/where non-UK registered vehicles are allowed to drive in the UK. It's our favourite bedtime read! Simply, visitors for less than 6 months can use a non-UK vehicle - anyone living in the UK cannot drive a non-UK personal vehicle, it is a myth that they have 6 months grace (there is an exemption for certain students and Ukrainian nationals in Ukrainian registered vehicles). As the cars insurance covers 6 months as a visitor the driver was dealt with for no insurance, the driver was reported to HMRC for undeclared work and business causing use of uninsured vehicle reported.

Attended YET ANOTHER report of a bridge strike from a HGV at the notorious A5 railway bridge in Hinckley. By the time this was reported to Police, the driver had left the scene. Network Rail attended and confirmed that there had been no damage caused this time. However if you are a HGV driver, please ensure you know the height of your vehicle and trailer. Don't ignore height restriction signage (it won't be wrong), and if you do crash into something, don't just leave!
