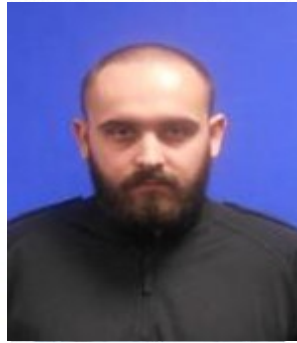

What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will prioritise the following in January 2024.

Priority 1: Anti-social Behaviour (ASB)

You said: General ASB often focuses around Blaby Precinct with youths gathering outside of shops and in the car park. ASB can also be noted in and around the open green spaces.

Priority 2: Nuisance Motorbikes

You Said: We have received reports of ASB related behaviour. Behaviour regularly coincides with the use of motorcycles/mopeds/e-scooters.

Priority 3: Road Safety

You Said: The Road Safety priority often focuses around speeding issues and includes residential and main arterial roads.

What we are doing

Priority 1: Antisocial Behaviour (ASB) - We Did: Last month saw a couple more reports of a male emptying bins in the Blaby Town centre. We do know who this male is and he has been dealt with for these incidents. No further incidents have been reported since.

Priority 2: Nuisance Motorbikes— We Did: This past month has seen a few reports of off road style motorbikes riding around the Cambridge Road area of Cosby. The beat team are trying to identify the riders of these bike from CCTV and are also conducting patrols during times reported. We have also received reports of similar bikes on the Blaby bypass.

Priority 3: Road Safety — We Did: Last month saw no reports of large scale car meets or racing on the bypass however we have had reports of bikes causing a nuisance on the Blaby by pass and surrounding area. Intelligence regarding car meets continues to be monitored and we will act on any reports we receive.

Appeal to trace owners of recovered property

Detectives investigating a series of burglaries across the force area have released images of property they've recovered in a bid to locate the owners.

Earlier this year, an operation targeting those suspected of being involved in burglary offences since November 2023, resulted in ten people being arrested in connection with the incidents. The suspects remain on bail pending further enquiries.

During the enquiries several items were recovered and offices wish to identify the owners.

Amongst the items recovered were a number of designer watches including a Audemars Piguet Royal Oak watch, stone encrusted Rolex, Rolex Submariner and a Thomas Sabo watch.

Other items included a Louis Vuitton bracelet; two Monaco Classic collection link chains; gold coloured chain with cross/religious symbol; gold coloured ring with centre stone set in a halo of stones; gold ring with square stone and stones around the edge and Swarovski gold bracelet with stones.

If you recognise any of these items and believe they belong to you, please get in touch. Potential owners must be able to provide proof of ownership.
