What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will prioritise the following in September 2023.

Priority 1: Road Safety

You said: That Road Safety issues are your number 1 concern.

What we are going to do: Continue to target those who drive on our beat with no TAX, no MOT and no insurance. Priority 2: Antisocial Behaviour (ASB)

You Said: Anti-Social Behaviour including use of motorbikes on open spaces was an issue to you.

What we are going to do: Targeted patrols, particularly at night time, to deter Anti-social Behaviour and continue to work with partnership agencies such as the Council to identify those causing a nuisance to our area.

What we are doing

Priority 1: Road Safety:

You Said – Road Safety

We Did -Local officers have worked with staff at Enderby Leisure centre to tackle parking around busy school times with extra parking being allocated for customers. During school term time officers have completed patrols around local schools to deter inconsiderate parking including illegal parking on double yellow lines, junctions and school crossing.

Priority 2: Antisocial Behaviour (ASB)

You Said - Anti-Social Behaviour

We Did – We have received many reports of antisocial behaviour around Asda and McDonalds in the past month. As a beat team we continue to work with security and local partners to tackle the issue of anti-social behaviour particularly around Fosse Park however all over the Beat and actively look to identify offenders and take positive action. You Said – Drug taking

We Did-This month issues have been raised around the Huncote Road/Coltbeck Avenue area of Narborough. There has been increased patrols around Fosse Park following reports of gas cannisters being inhaled. The beat team have carried on with proactive patrols within the village and hot spots that have been brought to our attention by members of the public. We manage this on a daily basis and anything that is reported will be actively patrolled, focusing on key times and days and gaining relevant information.

This month, we have seen a few changes to the beat team. After almost 8 months on the beat team, PCSO Grace is moving on permanently to the Market Bosworth Beat team.
