PC Darbar and PC Makda had a busy shift assisting our response colleagues with a number of incidents, including attending domestic-related calls. Later in the shift, they were deployed to help search for a high-risk missing person. During searches near the canal, officers located the individual hidden in bushes nearby. Officers were able to safely engage with them, provide reassurance, and return them to a place of safety. A great example of teamwork and dedication to protecting vulnerable people in our community.



PC Wicks and PC Makda were joined by colleagues from Leicestershire Fire & Rescue Service on Falmouth Road on the Evington beat as part of joint work to address local concerns. We're aware of reports of anti-social behaviour taking place within the stairwells – something that can have a real impact on residents' safety. Falmouth Estates are actively exploring practical solutions to address the issue, with a focus on prevention while still fully complying with fire safety regulations. This partnership approach highlights how agencies are working together to find effective, long-term solutions that keep residents both safe and secure.



PCSO Meerun and PCSO Arichandra were out on patrol on the Rowllatts Hill Estate, following reports of anti-social behaviour in the area - particularly around Oakdale Care Home. Regular ASB patrols like these are important in helping us identify issues early, provide reassurance to the community, and deter further incidents. Being visible and engaging with residents allows us to better understand local concerns and take appropriate action where needed.



PCSO Reed and PCSO Cook, who cover the St Matthews and North Evington beats respectively, were invited for a Summer Fun Day at Spinney Hill Park. It was great to engage with so many residents and visitors. The children (and adults) enjoyed looking at the police car and dressing up in our uniform. There were lots of happy faces and everyone seemed to be having a great time in the sunshine.

It is a solemn reminder that even in times of criticism of the Police there are a high number of people that will assist us and work with us. Thank you! As planning is in place for Festival season we are working with a number of locations to educate our local communities about the lawful demands of holding events and how we can work together to ensure they are safe and secure. Unfortunately as the good work came in I was made aware of an officer who works with me having been assaulted as they tried to arrest two wanted persons. During this the officer received injuries to their head and hands and so we will now look at how we can support them to get them back to work.
