## What matters to you

**We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will prioritise the following,**

- **Priority 1 - What you have said:**

You have told us that anti-social behaviour (ASB) is a concern in your community, particularly involving the use of quad bikes and groups of rowdy youths gathering in parks and recreational areas.

- **Action taken**

We have received reports of vehicles committing ASB, including car cruising, off-road biking, and misuse of e-scooters. Officers have carried out enforcement under Section 59 of the Police Reform Act and continue to monitor hotspot locations. Work is underway with local councils and landowners to explore longer-term solutions, including signage and environmental measures to deter offending.

- **Priority 2 -**

**What you have said:**

The community has also stated that theft from motor vehicles are concern at various locations throughout the Charnwood East area.

**Action taken**

There has been an increase in reports of theft from vehicles across the NL61 area. Officers are conducting targeted patrols in hotspot locations and sharing crime prevention advice with residents. Investigations are ongoing to identify offenders, and intelligence is being gathered to support enforcement activity.

- **Priority 3 -**

**What you have said:**

Residential burglaries has been identified as a growing concern within the beat,

**Action taken**

Reports of residential burglaries have been received in the NL61 area. Officers have increased overnight patrols and are working closely with CID to progress investigations. Crime prevention advice has been circulated to residents, and engagement with Neighbourhood Watch groups continues to help reduce risk and reassure the community.

# The Beat Team News

Everyday your local beat team are conducting marked Police car patrols through the villages of Charnwood East. These villages are Syston, Thurmaston, Thrussington, East Goscote, Ratcliffe on the Wreake, Barkby, Barbky Thorpe, Beeby, Rearsby, Hamilton Lea, Queniborough, South Croxton and Thorpebury in the Limes.

Thank you to those who came to our beat engagements this month. Thank you to those for raising their concerns and for all the positive feedback.



On 21/02, PCSO 6024 visited the Scouts Hut in East Goscote to talk with the young people about policing in their community.

The group had the chance to take a closer look at the police uniform, learn what each part is used for, and even explore the police car.

On 10/02, officers from the beat team met with a Davidsons site engineer and a representative from the council to discuss ongoing concerns around motorbike use in the Thorpebury in the limes area.



On 19/02, PCSO 6024 held a beat surgery in Syston town square, engaging with local residents and businesses about the issues that matter most to them. Thank you to everyone who stopped for a chat.



Officers also attended the food bank and warm space in Syston, speaking with residents and volunteers who are doing incredible work supporting the community.

Over the past two months, the Charnwood Beat Team, with support from traffic units, has maintained a high-visibility presence at Thurmaston Retail Park in response to concerns around anti-social behaviour. This proactive approach has included regular patrols and, on one occasion, the issuing of a dispersal order to address disruptive activity. We continue to work closely with retail park management and the local authority to develop a sustainable, long-term solution that promotes safety and reassurance for both businesses and visitors to the area.

After a car failed to stop for the beat team in Thurmaston, the car and occupants were located and the vehicle was seized for no insurance. An imitation firearm was also found inside the car. Both males have now been released on police bail for public order, firearms and driving offences while enquiries continue.



On 28/02, PCSO 6024 and 6098 attended the unveiling of the decommissioned post box in Syston.



On 19/02, officers completed a small patch walk with Charnwood borough Council representatives in Thurmaston, gaining valuable insight into local issues and discussing how we can continue working together on improvements.



On 11/02, PCSO 6024 and PC 1651 conducted a beat engagement at East Goscote Library, engaging with local residents about their concerns.
