What matters to you

From information collated from local surveys, beat knowledge, intelligence and reports to Leicestershire Police, the following areas have been highlighted as priorities within the community.

your priorities for September 2024 are as follows...

Priority 1: Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) in the area of the shops on Queens Road and Clarendon Park Road. Some incidents relate to drug or alcohol use and others relate to rowdy behaviour.

You said: ASB - Anti-Social Behaviour is a priority for residents of the ward. This is a generic policing issue that we aim to tackle robustly wherever identified, through feedback from our community Queens Road has been raised as an area of concern.

We manage reports of Anti Social behaviour through using our partnership working platform sentinel, this system allows us to communicate with partner agencies such as the council to manage these cases efficiently.

We did: Through our patrols and excellent engagement with the community the beat team identified Clarendon Park Gardens as an anti social behaviour hotspot as well as Queens Road and the surrounding area several months ago. In response to the issues raised the beat team promptly took action via the immediate implementation of a problem management plan (PMP) at the location.

Through increased patrols we identified several perpetrators and some of these were dealt with via out of court disposals and one was arrested and subsequently dealt with for drugs offences.

Through community consultation as well as a steep decline in incidents in the area has shown the effectiveness that a problem management plan and proactive working can do in preventing and deterring ASB and it's associated offences.

We will be closing the problem management plan on Clarendon Park Gardens once our priorities are renewed this month via the #yourviews survery which can be completed on our messaging platform neighbourhood link.

The beat team have also proactively responded to and subsequently dealt new identified areas asocial behaviour this month, Adderley Road and St Leonards court, these issues have been resolved and have wielded positive results for their respective communities however work in regards to the issues at Springfield Road is still ongoing but we are in close links with the residents and are working with them alongside partners to deal with the issues here.

Priority 2: Anti-social use of cars on Granville Road during evenings.

You said: Through crime pattern analysis intertwined with feedback provided by the community we have introduced "Anti-social use of cars on Granville Road" as a beat priority.

We did: This priority was responded to by the implementation of a problem management plan and this has now reached its second month being active, there is ongoing work with the our partners at the council and this resulted in the upcoming implementation of road safety signage in the area alongside frequent patrols by the beat team.

Further support has been provided Leicestershire police's road policing unit as well as our safer roads team to deal with this issue.

Thus far several driver have been identified as driving in an anti social manner and have been served with section 59 notices.

Further targeted patrol's will continue in the area to address the issue, making the car park safer for pedestrian's and safe driver's alike.

• Priority 3: Work towards reducing theft from motor vehicle offences (TFMV) in the area, by carrying out prevention and educational work.

You said: The beat team have responded to this priority through crime prevention awareness, uniformed patrols and robust targeting of offenders. We will update our community whenever possible on any identified crime trends through good communications with our community.

We did: residential burglary and vehicle crime figures remain low on the Clarendon Park area, we continue to work with Leicester University and WQE college educating students in keeping the property safe and secure as well as continuing proactive patrols at locations that have been historically targeted for priority associated offences.

As we face the darker months ahead we will be increasing our patrols on the beat and we are currently planning policing operation's in which we will be targeting offenders, monitoring incidents and intelligence via pattern analysis In order to coordinate our patrols and reduce the threat facing the community. We will also be educating the local community on crime prevention and working with partners to ensure people are staying safe and secure in their homes this coming autumn.

Other Local News



Following an report of drug dealing In the area of St Mary's triangle, the beat team have increased police presence in the area and this has resulted in multiple intelligence logs, an abandoned vehicle being recovered under DVLA powers as well as the identified and subsequent dealing of a perpetrator involved in anti social behaviour.



In accordance with our 2nd beat priority, Granville Road car park has been subject to increased proactive patrols in the area by local officers from the Clarendon Park beat team. These patrols are in support of the ongoing problem management plan currently active in the area.

Several perpetrators have already been identified and have been served with section 59 notices and we look to serve more to perpetrators causing harm to our community through further problem management tasking.



The beat team have been busy keeping up with training about upcoming changes in legislation as well as how to better serve our communities.

The beat team have been diligently responding to the concern's raised by the community by addressing the beat priorities, attending incidents, safeguarding vulnerable persons and working with our partner agencies and providing feedback to our community.

You may not always see us however we are always working in the background to address issues in the community, if you'd like to speak to a member of the beat team you attend one of our community engagement consultation's, specific dates for these can be seen at the bottom of the newsletter.
