Priority 2: Speeding and Road safety. **What we are going to do:** The beat team will deal with issues of road safety and speeding in Charnwood West villages. If you believe that there is an issue in your area, let the beat team know.

Priority 3: Drugs. **What we are going to do:** The beat team will deal with incidences of drug use and dealing across the beat area. Patrolling identified areas, utilising stop search powers where available and develop intelligence to allow us to target dealing within your area.

The Charnwood West Dedicated Neighbourhood Team have been working throughout June to tackle our chosen priorities of Speeding and Road Traffic Safety, Anti Social Behaviour and Drugs (including use and drug dealing). All the team featuring Sergeant Adkin, PC Nicholson, PCSO Martin and PCSO Colley have been working both out on the beat engaging with the community, and completing essential behind the scenes administrative work on the below and other aspects of policing:

Speeding and Road Traffic Safety

The Charnwood West Dedicated Neighbourhood Officers (DNO) team continues to take action against speeding in areas identified as high-risk by our community and data analysis. Our mobile speed gun operations remain active, and we are committed to issuing Traffic Offence Reports and warnings where appropriate. During the month of June two locations were covered:

- Swithland Lane, Rothley: 85 vehicles checked, 8 exceeded 35mph → police action taken
- Main Street, Swithland: 75 vehicles checked, 4 exceeded 35mph → police action taken.

These figures reflect our ongoing efforts to improve road safety and reduce speeding in residential and rural areas. We're also working with the Road Safety Partnership to deploy Speed Camera Vans in high-risk areas across Leicester, Leicestershire, and Rutland.



Anti-Social Behaviour

The Charnwood West Beat Team continues to carry out weekly patrols to anti-social behaviour (ASB) hot spots, working closely with Charnwood Borough Council and local housing providers to ensure a coordinated response. This joint approach helps us stay on top of ongoing ASB reports and take timely action. During the month of June the beat team have carried out a joint agency patch walk in Rothley, and as part of the incremental approach, officers have issued words of advice and issued a community resolution at two separate addresses in Quorn. The team has also attended court and will be taking further action towards a prosecution at an address in Rothley.

Drugs and Drug Dealing

The team continue to develop intelligence relating to a number of addresses following on from last month and updates will follow where sufficient information allows for enforcement. Recently our intel development lead to the search and seizure of a vehicle suspected to be involved in Class B dealing by Loughborough Station Response officers- a great collaborative work between the Dedicated Neighbourhood Beat Team and Charnwood Response Officers!
