What matters to you

- Anti Social Behaviour —You have told us that Anti-Social behaviour causes you concern. This can be things like excessive noise, parties, smoking drugs and more. We will be working with partners to ensure we can tackle these issues and prevent them occurring again.
- Motor vehicle crime—You told us that you were concerned about vehicle crime. This can be theft of motor vehicles or theft from motor vehicles, this also includes theft of tools from vans and theft of catalytic convertors.
- Road Safety—You have told us that Road Safety is a priority, this includes things like Speeding, Insurance,
 MOT and driving offences.

What have we done #yousaidwedid

- Anti Social Behaviour—The local neighbourhood team conduct regular patrols in highlighted problem areas.
 - Officers will advertise on our social media channels when they are out and about patrolling
 - We record all ASB on our shared system with Harborough District Council and together we will do what we can to reduce problems and provide you with the satisfaction.
 - We continue to encourage you to report concerns and locations to us, we need this information to conduct more targeted patrols.
- Road Safety—the local beat team regularly conduct speed checks and deal with any traffic issues that are
 reported on the beat. We endeavour to update via social media or Neighbourhood Link when we complete
 these duties.

VE Day:

To mark the 80th Anniversary of VE Day the Broughton Astley Scouts Group held a VE Day event on Frolesworth Road Park.

CSP Event:

On 14th May PC 609 and PC 1035 attended a CSP Event (Community Safety Partnership Event) where agencies such as police, local housing, local and district council & mental health services all come together & be available to speak to the community. It was great to see so many people come and chat to us and discuss any issues they wished to raise.

OP Sceptre:

The 19th of May marked the start of OP Sceptre, a week of action to tackle knife crime and bring awareness around the risks of carrying knives. That week the local beat team completed knife sweeps around Frolesworth Road Park, visited HKCs (Habitual Knife Carriers) around the Harborough and Wigston area & had the knife amnesty bin at Market Harborough.



!!Health and Safety Advice!!:

With the good weather approaching, please make sure to be aware and advise your children not to swim in any open water, ponds or lakes. And not to trespass onto any land to go in the water.

We had reports last year of people trespassing onto private land to swim in ponds and lakes. This is a serious safety risk and can cause issues if someone becomes stuck in the water or goes into shock due to the cold temperatures.

The local beat team will complete patrols in these areas and anyone found trespassing the land to swim will be dealt with accordingly.
