What matters to you:

Priority 1: You told us that you were concerned about burglaries within the Oadby area.

What we are doing: Officers continue to conduct regular patrols of the areas where offences have occurred, these patrols are reducing the number of burglaries. We will continue to do this going forward. Where CCTV is available, this will provide valuable intelligence on times and when offences are happening and possible vehicles involved, to assist in our patrol strategy.

Priority 2: Road Safety You said: You have told us that Road Safety is a priority, this includes things like Speeding, Insurance, MOT and driving offences.

What we are doing: We have conducted vehicle speed checks at identified locations. Local officers have been targeting motorists' speeding, not wearing seatbelts, using mobile phones and drink/drug driving. Local officers have received reports of identified vehicles being driven without valid insurance, MOT and tax.

Priority 3: Anti-social Behaviour You Said: You have told us that Anti-Social behaviour causes you concern. This can be things like excessive noise, smoking drugs and more. We will be working with partners to ensure we can tackle these issues and reduce their occurrences.

What we are doing: Your local police beat team and response officers continue to patrol identified locations, as reported by yourselves with regards to anti-social behaviour and drug related incidents. Officers continue to stop check persons and vehicles who are involved in drugs. Local officers have identified vehicles which are related to criminality.

Tackling anti-social behaviour and drug-related concerns

Your local Oadby policing team continues to prioritise action against anti-social behaviour and drug-related activity across the area. Throughout December, officers have been carrying out targeted patrols in key locations, responding to community intelligence, and conducting stop checks on vehicles believed to be involved in suspicious activity. These proactive measures are already helping us disrupt criminal behaviour and keep our neighbourhoods safe. We have also been addressing reports of vehicles involved in anti-social behaviour. Increased visibility and engagement with drivers have supported our efforts to reduce nuisance driving and reassure residents.

Ongoing patrols and prime prevention

Throughout December, increased patrols across Oadby have played a key role in preventing burglaries and deterring criminal activity. We will continue to maintain a strong presence in the community as we move into the new year.

Recovery of stolen vehicles

During December PCSO Harks made yet another significant discovery while conducting routine patrols in Oadby. A suspiciously parked car caught attention of PCSO Harks, prompting a closer inspection. His curiosity and commitment to thorough policing led him to investigate the vehicle in detail, ultimately confirming it was stolen. This marks the third stolen car PCSO Harks has recovered in just three weeks, highlighting both the effectiveness of proactive patrols and his keen eye for detail.

On Saturday 13th December 2025, I hosted a 'Meet Your Police' session at Oadby Library. The session provided an opportunity for residents to discuss local policing matters and hear recent updates. Huge Congratulations to Sgt Paige Eaves!


