What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and have prioritised the following –

Priority 1: The beat team aim to tackle different elements of ASB in Mountsorrel

You said: You have concerns around antisocial behaviour across the village. We will continue to try and disrupt this type of behaviour and use the ASB incremental approach to deter offenders.

Priority 2: The beat team aim to target reports of speeding in Mountsorrel.

You said: You are concerned about vehicles speeding in the villages. We will continue to monitor and enforce speed across several sites in the village.

Priority 3: Burglaries.

We aim to work with the relevant authorities to reduce the burglaries across the village and to try and reduce the number of reported thefts from the recycling centre. Visiting victims and offering crime prevention advice.

What we have done #yousaidwedid

Priority 1: The beat team aim to tackle different elements of ASB in Mountsorrel

During the month of October the Beat Team have patrolled the ASB hotspot areas pointed out to us by local residents and the parish council such as, Halstead Road, The Green and Kingfisher Road both on foot and in a marked vehicle. We have visited and spoken with those identified as being involved in any anti-social behaviour. Our beat team have been working closely with partner agencies such as the local council and housing associations in order to tackle any issues which have been reported.



RECOGNISE AND REPORT
ANTISOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

We understand that antisocial behaviour (ASB) can cause distress. It can include Inconsiderate behaviour, inappropriate vehicle use, graffiti and neighbourhood disputes.

- ASB can have a lasting impact on neighbourhoods and communities as it can lead to an increase in crime, such as violence and criminal damage.
- Our response to ASB is to record it at the earliest opportunity, manage incidents and those responsible. Identify and support repeat victims and vulnerable people and reduce the risk of ASB reoccurring.
- We work in conjunction with partner agencies such as local councils, housing and wellbeing services to tackle and prevent ASB using a problem solving approach to achieve the best results for the communities we serve.

Priority 2: The beat team aim to target reports of speeding in Mountsorrel.

Speed Ops

On Wednesday 16th October 2024 speed checks were completed on Halstead Road and there were no vehicles found to be speeding during the time we were there. When we speak with the public they mention that speeding is a concern for them. The Beat Team will continue to complete speed checks within the area.



Priority 3: Burglaries

Burglary patrols are happening daily. Local beat officers and response officers across Charnwood NPA have been on foot patrol and vehicle patrols in the daytime and evenings.

Numerous residents have been visited to offer crime prevention advice and encouraged to sign up to Neighbourhood Link to enable more people to receive this advice from the police.

We also continue to visit victims of crime and burglary to offer further advice and make homes a harder target. The beat team have also worked with Carisbrook Road Neighbourhood Watch residents who are generously giving up their time to help make the community safer.
