Coalville Beat Priorities: July—September 2026

Grieve Close.

You Said : You have concerns regarding drug use and youth related ASB concerning bike use and damage in disused premises on and around Grieve Close.

We will: We will conduct multi agency visits to the area to speak to residents regarding the issues and actions we can take to tackle the issues.

We will work with local authorities and land and building owners to ensure we are maintaining the safety of residents and will take robust action against those causing harm.

Retail Crime – Belvoir Shopping centre and Whitwick Retail Park.

You Said: That local businesses are being subject to theft which includes repeat offenders targeting certain stores.

We Will: Complete targeted operations in the area, working with colleagues in CCTV to identify repeat offenders.

We will work with our local enforcement teams and our Safer Streets officers to identify those committing offences and seek convictions and long term orders to enable officers to take robust action.

Drug Dealing and associated ASB on Adam Morris Way

You Said: You have concerns regarding drug use and the anti-social behaviour associated with this type of criminality.

We will: Work with partners to complete multi agency visits in the location to seek your concerns and views. We will work with local targeting teams to develop intelligence and work to bring those causing harm to justice. We will also look to work with our legal teams to develop long term resolutions.

#WeDid - What we are doing

Off-road motorbikes

We conducted several joint patrols with Cat Rideway, Community Safety Officer for NWLDC . During these patrols, we addressed concerns raised by local residents regarding the use of off-road motorbikes on the recreation ground off Charles Street, Coalville.

These patrols will continue, and appropriate action will be taken where offences or incidents are identified. Ongoing high-visibility patrols will help deter anti-social behaviour, tackle community concerns, and keep local areas safe for residents.



#WeDid - What we are doing

Monthly Park meetings

Every month, the Parks Tactical Group meets to discuss anti-social behaviour (ASB) concerns affecting parks and open spaces managed by North West Leicestershire District Council (NWLDC).

We work closely with NWLDC to identify and address areas of concern, including criminal damage and other illegal activity. The Parks Team work tirelessly throughout the year to ensure our leisure spaces remain clean, safe, and enjoyable for everyone in the community.

During this month's meeting, damage to several trees in Coalville Park was highlighted. Sadly, it appears that someone has used an axe to deliberately hack at a number of trees, causing significant damage and resulting in some having to be removed.



Talk about a case of wrong place, wrong time... twice!

Officers attended an address looking for a missing person, but instead came across a male who was wanted by police- ARRESTED

As officers were dealing with the incident, another male decided it was time for a sprint and ran from the scene. Unfortunately for him, officers were quicker!

When stopped, he attempted to throw officers off the scent by providing FALSE details – which turned out to be of a wanted male. As a result, he was arrested. However, after officers established his true identity, it turned out that he was also wanted by police! A successful day showcasing the teamwork between Response Officers, Beat Officers and PCSOs, working together to keep Coalville safe and bring wanted offenders into custody.



Anti Social Behaviour at Whitwick Retail Park

Unfortunately we have been receiving reports of anti social behaviour involving vehicles at Whitwick Retail Park, Coalville. These reports are of vehicles racing, driving dangerously and manoeuvring in a way which are considered anti social.

The local beat team will be patrolling and engaging with those that meet at the location. We will also working with the management company for the location for longer terms solutions.
