Anti-Social Behaviour - 1. Ongoing issues with large groups of youths, particularly on public parks and open spaces, fighting, playing loud music, being abusive, drinking and using drugs. 2. Use of vehicle driving erratically and having noisy exhaust and revving the engines.	Officers attended to reports of Quad bike riders in the area of Royston Drive, upon Officers arrival we were unable to locate them, we would urge anyone with any information to contact us.
Reports of drug dealing and using at a number of addresses on the beat, with high interest to the rest of the county and other counties. This is attracting undesirables to the location and often resulting in ASB and disorder at the addresses.	Intelligence work is being carried out in relation to a drug deal in the street which was reported to us.
Speeding of vehicles along a number of roads on the beat, breaches of weight restrictions and bridge strikes all lead to a feeling amongst the community that road safety is an issue. Along with multiple parking issues in regards to school times and busy roads Users driving with no documents such as Insurance, MOT and Tax. With no licenses.	Patrols have been carried out around Factory Road after reports of vehicle owners parking their cars on the pavement.

News

Officers from Hinckley joined our partners from Leicestershire Trading standards at 3 premises in Hinckley. The operation uncovered a significant quantity of Illegal cigarettes, tobacco and vapes from 2 of the premises. These illegal products often lack proper health warnings and safety features and pose a significant health risk to consumers. The illicit tobacco trade also undermines public health initiatives and deprives the government of tax revenue. Profits from such activities may be linked to organised crime and possible funding of other illegal enterprises.



PCSO Steve and PC Sam were out on a joint Beat patrol around traffic hotspot areas, especially parking around our local Schools. Funnily enough our presence resulted in very few incidents of concern and parents and taxi's picking up pupils were being good! We only had to advise a few parents for parking in restricted areas. It resulted in some useful community engagement with residents and teachers waiting outside.
