#YouSaidWeDid - What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will prioritise the following;

Priority 1: Anti-social Behaviour in and around Braunstone Park and Cort Crescent

You said: Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) in and around Braunstone Park and Cort Crescent has again been identified as a priority concern from the community and now with the lighter nights arriving we will continue to target and focus on this area of concern.

What we are going to do: Dedicated patrols have been put in place for the area. The beat team are continuing to tackle anti-social behaviour in the area. We continue to manage this concern via a Problem Management Plan, and are working with our partners in respect of this matter. Over the past 3 months we have been experiencing issues with youths throwing items/eggs at passing vehicles in this identified area and whilst this has reduced significantly, we acknowledge there are still issues with this type of ASB. We also recognise Braunstone Park is a place for the whole community to come and relax especially in the warmer Spring/Summer months so we aim to continue working towards dealing with all areas of ASB within it and will provide some updates later this month.

Priority 2: Road Safety

You Said: From Community Surveys and Feedback on Neighbourhood Link, Road Safety has been highlighted to be a local concern for our Beat. As such we will continue to keep this as a priority and Speeding vehicles has been identified as being one of the main points of concern within the community.

What we are going to do: Throughout this second quarter of 2025 we will again focus on Road Safety issues as a Beat Priority. Whilst there are many strands to this priority we will look to cover as many angles as we can. Over the past 3 months we have been covering Road Safety from a variety of angles and whilst Speeding vehicles is the main concern we will still aim to work with our partners in addressing not only this issue, but the wider aspects of Road Safety. We look forward to updating you further.

Priority 3: Anti-social Behaviour (Drug related)

You Said: From the Surveys on Neighbourhood Link you have told us that drug dealing and usage at addresses across the Braunstone and Rowley Fields area is your top concern and problem that you want us to keep focus on - so we are!

What we are going to do: Throughout the first 3 months of 2025 we have been providing monthly updates about our enforcement around Drugs dealing and identified addresses. We will look to take more action where we can in line with information and intelligence that is reported to us by our communities and continue to tackle this area of concern. we look forward to providing more updates.

April has proved to be yet another very busy month for the local beat team;

- A warrant has been executed at an address on Nutfield Road. This led to the discovery of a cannabis grow. With great team work from all officers on the beat, the grow was destroyed and the investigation continues.
- A wanted male was spotted by PCSOs Beth + Julie.
 He was outstanding for multiple high value shop
 thefts. With assistance from Beaumont Leys PCs,
 the male was quickly detained and conveyed to
 custody.
- PCs Chelsea, George and SGT Graeme attended an address on the beat area to conduct an urgent search warrant. The were assisted by colleagues from the Beaumont Ward, CID and the City Neighbourhood Priority Team. A male was arrested for a serious assault, and a large quantity of suspected Class A drugs were located.
- PCs George and Chelsea located and arrested a male who was wanted for a burglary.
- PCSOs have carried out neighbourhood consultations in the area of Hamelin Road, Bennett Walk,
 Blackmore Drive and Gaskell Walk where there has bene concerns about drug dealing. If you weren't around but want to share your concerns, please feel free to message us using Neighbourhood Link.
 - PCs and PCSOs from the beat team—along with SGT Graeme—assisted colleagues from Leicester City Council with the eviction of tenants from a problem address associated with drug use and anti--social behaviour.
