## #YouSaid - What matters to you

**Below are our beat priorities -**

**Priority:**

Dealing with the anti-social behaviour involving the illegal use of e-scooters and off-road bikes across the ward.

**Update:**

We Did: We continue to target antisocial behaviour connected to e-scooters. We have supported extensive patrols across West Leicester this month to deter the use of e-scooters and e-bikes both for anti-social behaviour and wider, more serious crime. We maintain our focus on messaging to raise awareness of the law around e-scooters.

**Priority:**

Dealing with the production of class B drugs on the area, in addition to tackling the use and supply of both class A and B drugs in areas where this affects the local community.

**Update:**

In May we have continued to disrupt the production of cannabis, with a warrant executed on Paget Road and cannabis seized. A male was arrested from this location and the investigation into his alleged offending is ongoing.

**Priority:**

Targeting those on the ward who commit anti-social behaviour, particularly where this is connected to drinking or drug use in public. This includes in open spaces such as The Rally, Glenfield Road East and Hinckley Road near the junction with Kirby Road.

**Update:**

In May we have worked hard to patrol our parks and open spaces, particularly during the beginning and end of the school days. We have proactively engaged with an unauthorised encampment on the Fosse Recreation Ground, which has now been cleared. We have worked with partners to clear an address on Bolton road which was attracting squatters and anti-social behaviour. This has been re-secured and shouldn't attract any further issues. Work around The Rally and Glenfield Road East in conjunction with Leicester City Council remains ongoing.

# What we are doing



Fosse Beat officers have taken part in a national week long operation targeting knife crime.



Welcome to the May edition of the Fosse Neighbourhood Team Newsletter.

May has seen the Fosse officers deployed across the ward tackling a variety of duties.

Operation Sceptre, a nationwide initiative to tackle knife crime, took place over the 18th to the 24th of this month. A number of shops were visited and advice given about selling bladed items to under age persons. Alongside this, a search of The Rally Park was conducted and a knife recovered. This was deposited into the knife bin at Beaumont Leys Police Station.

If you have any knives to dispose of, perhaps you've treated your partner to a new kitchen set to make their life easier, you can take the old ones to a police station and put them into our purpose made knife bins. Your closest ones are at Beaumont Leys or Braunstone police stations.

May has seen two more cannabis factories raided and closed down. Plants and equipment destroyed and the properties will be refurbished and rented out for people to live in. We know that these factories are a constant problem in the area. If you have any suspicions about a location, call us or even easier, report it online through the Leicestershire Police website. The online system is very user friendly.

A member of public reported concerns regarding the behaviour of some persons at an address on Bolton Road. This amounted to anti social behaviour and officers took action. The occupants of the property, with the co-operation of a grateful landlord, have been removed from the house and peace has returned to the local residents. Once again, we rely on the public to report any concerns they have to us.

This month has seen a rise in vehicles being broken into and items stolen from inside. We are aware of this spree and are increasing patrols targeting the areas affected. Please think about what you leave in your vehicle. I tend to leave nothing in my personal car, and leave the glove-box open so that it plainly shows there is nothing in it. Thieves will break in, even if just for the pound coin you keep for the shopping trolley.
