Beat Priorities

Road Safety:

Proactive traffic operations have been conducted in the area in the interest of road safety.

The beat team have been out and about on mobile patrol dealing robustly with those committing moving traffic offenses such as speeding and drink/drug driving in an effort to improve road safety within the local area.

The team have been working in conjunction with Leicester City Council and our Traffic Management Team to identify areas of concern and to consider a longer term solution through traffic calming measures and more appropriate road signage.

Beat officers have been providing patrols at local schools at key times to improve the safety of pupils, parents and road users.

Anti-Social Behaviour:

Officers have performed plain clothed and high visibility patrols in open spaces in order to take positive action against ASB when appropriate.

The team have met with the Council Wardens and Leicester City Council to discuss ASB deterrence, prevention and to develop a working strategy for the warmer months ahead.

Officers have been conducting beat surgeries and liaising with the local community to identify any issues of concern. In addition, officers have conducted patch walks with partner agencies to address issues of ASB around Lyle Close, Gilbert Close and Butler Close.

Those responsible for causing the issues have been dealt with robustly where appropriate and has led to a reduction of ASB following this intervention.

Burglaries:

Officers have performed high visibility patrols in hot spot areas to offer community reassurance and an increased police presence.

When attending incidents of burglary, Leicestershire Police will deliver a professional, effective, and efficient service that will in turn improve standards of investigation and outcomes.

The local beat team will continue to provide beat surgeries across the Rushey Mead Area. Here you can meet the team and speak to us about any concerns you may have. We will also provide you with target-hardening advice around keeping yourselves and your homes safe.
