Your priorities are chosen quarterly and are based upon information gathered through NHL (Neighbourhood Link), social media, local engagement, and emerging crime trends. You have stated that the following key themes are important to you. #YouSaidWeDid

You Said	We did
ASB (Anti-Social Behaviour) – Ongoing issues with large groups of youths, particularly on public parks, fighting, playing loud music, being abusive, drinking and using drugs.	We have increased patrols at several locations including Richmond Park after further reports of youths causing ongoing ASB at the location.
Drugs – Reports of drug dealing and using at several addresses on the beat, attracting undesirables to the location and often resulting in ASB (Anti-Social Behaviour) and disorder at the addresses.	Intelligence received in relation to drug activity is being developed. Officers will look to obtain Warrants where possible
Road Safety – Speeding of vehicles along several roads on the beat, breaches of weight restrictions and bridge strikes all lead to a feeling amongst the community that road safety is an issue.	We Conducted high visibility speed checks at key complaint locations using handheld enforcement devices and support from the Roads Policing Unit (RPU). Deployed speed indicator devices (SID) to capture data, improve driver compliance and identify peak offending times.

## News

We've seen a rise in shed burglaries across the Greater Hinckley area, with offenders targeting tools, bicycles and garden equipment. We know how upsetting these incidents can be and we want to reassure our community that we're taking action. In recent days, the Greater Hinckley Beat Team has Increased patrols in affected locations, both day and night, spoken with residents to offer advice and gather information, provided crime prevention equipment to victims and vulnerable properties, including shed alarms, window alarms, and alarmed padlocks (see photos) We're also encouraging all residents to review their own shed and outbuilding security: Use high quality locks on doors and windows, install lighting or CCTV where possible, secure valuable items to fixed points inside, mark tools and equipment to help us identify stolen property. If you see anything suspicious, please report it via 101 or through the Leicestershire Police website. Always call 999 if a crime is in progress.



An appeal is being made for witnesses or anyone with dashcam footage to come forward after phones and telecoms devices were stolen from a lorry while it was in transit on the A5 Watling Street. Just before 6pm on Monday 23 February a report was received that the items had been taken when the lorry arrived at its destination in Logix Road, Burbage. It is believed that the items were stolen while the lorry was in slow moving traffic between Wolvey Road and Logix Road just after 5pm. From initial enquiries carried out by officers, it is believed two white vans – one of which was a Ford Transit – a small, beige-coloured saloon and a silver Audi A4 may have been used by the suspects during the incident. Detective Inspector Claire Hughes, from our City CID, said: "We know there were other vehicles on the road at the time and I'd like to speak to any motorists who saw anything unusual or suspicious to get in touch. I'm particularly keen to speak to anyone who saw the lorry or any of the cars that might have been involved. "There are paths on either side of the A5 in that location and I'd also like to speak to anyone who was walking along the road and has information that might be able to help. "Anything you can tell us, no matter how insignificant you think it might be, could assist the investigation."
