Priority 1: Drug Dealing

You said: Issues re drug dealing in the local community.

What we are going to do: Patrols are taking place throughout the day and night and stop search powers are being utilised where grounds permit. Anyone found with illegal substances on them are being dealt with accordingly. Further patrols are also taking place throughout hot spot areas to build up intelligence that can be acted on. Please continue to report any suspicious activity to us.

PCSO Rushby has been investigating various leads into reports of drugs use around the beat primarily focusing on residential hotspots that have seen an increase of late especially over the summer holidays.

Priority 2: Road Safety

You said: Speeding and road safety on the beat is a concern for you.

We have heard your concerns especially in certain areas of the beat where speeding has become a more notable issue of late. The beat team are especially focusing around the areas of Nottingham and Scalford Roads as well as Welby Lane, with more planned patrols in the areas over the coming weeks.

Priority 3: Anti-social Behaviour

The School summer Holidays are almost at a close, extra patrols will be still taking place in an effort to minimize anti social behaviour and general criminality.

You Said: Concerns raised relating to youth related Anti Social Behaviour.

What we are going to do: Support residents on an individual basis where complaints are made, challenge those involved and work with partner agencies to implement outcomes. Complete targeted patrols where identified to disrupt and

- High-visibility **foot patrols** were conducted in hotspot areas.
- We have been supporting our response teams with **live incidents** throughout August too and completing high visible patrols often on foot in some of our hotspot areas.
- PC O'Rourke has been busy with more than a few incidents over the last month around the beat here are some just to name a few:
 - Car seized for being driven around with no insurance
 - Arrest of a well know shop lifter for targeting stores across Melton
 - Arrest of a male for domestic incident

- We have been dealing with local issues such as Anti-social Behaviour and safeguarding vulnerable residents as and when we identify concerns.
- Ongoing patrols in areas of concerns to identify those involved and reduce incidents. Some of these areas include the Melton Mowbray Town Centre and areas on the beat linked to drug activity.
- Work ongoing with local schools where incidents of bullying and assaults have been brought to the attention of Police.
- We have also been helping in regarding to other issues that come to Police such as neighbour disputes, events that impact and cause community concerns, gaining intelligence regarding criminal activity and addressing community safety concerns.
