#YouSaidWeDid - What matters to you

Priority 1: Anti-social Behaviour in and around Braunstone Park, Cort Crescent and Gallards Hill

You said: Anti-Social Behaviour in and around Braunstone Park continues as a priority concern from the community. Over the winter period, the team will continue to concentrate on this location.

We Did: Anti-social behaviour (ASB) in and around Braunstone Park remains a key priority for the team. Over the past month, officers have continued to maintain regular high visibility patrols across the park and surrounding areas, ensuring a consistent policing presence. The nightly ASB car has also continued to proactively target the location, providing sustained coverage during peak times and reinforcing our visibility.

As a result of this ongoing focus, we have continued to see a reduction in ASB related calls, both within the park and at Winstanley House. The team will maintain this level of engagement and visibility as we move into the Spring period.

Priority 2: Road Safety

You Said: From Community Surveys and Feedback on Neighbourhood Link, road safety has been highlighted to be a local concern. We will continue to concentrate on speeding concerns and anti social behaviour caused by e bikes, e scooters and off road motor-bikes.

We Did: Road safety continues to be a key local concern highlighted through Community Surveys and Neighbourhood Link feedback. In response, the team has maintained a strong focus on tackling speeding issues and anti social behaviour involving e bikes, e scooters and off road motorbikes.

Throughout January, officers have carried out multiple Op Pedalfast operations across Braunstone and Rowley Fields. Since the operation began on 22nd August, this work has led to the seizure of 53 e scooters and 42 e bikes, alongside the recovery of a stolen motorbike and stolen bicycle. Several arrests have also been made for a range of additional offences identified during these deployments.

Community feedback has been extremely positive, and we remain committed to removing illegal and dangerous vehicles from roads and footpaths to keep the area safe. We will continue to take targeted action to address road safety concerns raised by the community.

Priority 3: Anti-social Behaviour (Drug related)

You Said: From the Surveys on Neighbourhood Link you have told us that drug dealing and usage at locations across the Braunstone and Rowley Fields area is a concern.

We Did: Feedback from Neighbourhood Link surveys has highlighted ongoing concerns about drug dealing and drug use across the Braunstone and Rowley Fields area. In response, the team has continued to take proactive enforcement action throughout January.

So far this year, officers have executed 14 Misuse of Drugs Act warrants, all driven by intelligence provided directly by the community. This has been supported by multiple arrests for drug related offences across the beat. This included 2 warrants on Sybil Road and 1 on Wolverton Road. We remain committed to acting on the information you share with us and will continue working to disrupt drug related activity across the area.

Good news

Good News From Your Neighbourhood Policing Team in February;

- **Stolen Vehicle Recovered Within Hours**
During ASB patrols, PCSOs Beth and Julie swiftly located a stolen vehicle—just two hours after it had been taken during a burglary. Thanks to their keen patrol work, the vehicle was safely recovered.
- **Van Seized Using New Traffic Powers**
PCSOs Julie and Beth also made good use of their newly acquired traffic powers, seizing a van being driven with no insurance. A great example of training being put straight into action.
- **Cannabis Grow Dismantled**
PC George secured a warrant for an address on Wolverton Road, which led to the discovery of a cannabis grow. With support from PCs Chelsea, Ryan and Paige, the grow was safely dismantled and enquiries are ongoing.
- **Safeguarding Our Community**
PCs Paige, Ryan, Chelsea and George have carried out numerous safeguarding visits across the beat area. Their efforts have ensured that vulnerable residents receive the support they need and deserve.
- **Another Stolen Vehicle Off the Streets**
PCSOs Beth and Julie have been busy once again—this time locating and recovering a second stolen vehicle, which had been travelling on false plates.
- **Significant Charges After Major Discovery**
Two males have now been charged and remanded following a warrant executed on Sybil Road. This operation uncovered two established cannabis grows, with a combined estimated street value of over £350,000.
