Priority 1: Drug Dealing

You said: Issues re drug dealing in the local community.

What we are going to do: Patrols are taking place throughout the day and night and stop search powers are being utilised where grounds permit. Anyone found with illegal substances on them are being dealt with accordingly. Further patrols are also taking place throughout hot spot areas to build up intelligence that can be acted on. Please continue to report any suspicious activity to us.

Priority 2: Road Safety

You said: Speeding and road safety on the beat is a concern for you.

The beat team seized a car and the driver was dealt with by issuing a traffic offence report (TOR) for driving without insurance.

The Beat team also attended a RTC where by the driver was driving on a provisional licence and had two bold tyres. They will now be dealt with accordingly.

Priority 3: Anti-social Behaviour

It is now the School summer Holidays so extra patrols will take place to minimize anti social behaviour and general criminality.

You Said: Concerns raised relating to youth related Anti Social Behaviour.

What we are going to do: Support residents on an individual basis where complaints are made, challenge those involved and work with partner agencies to implement outcomes. Complete targeted patrols where identified to disrupt and challenge behaviour. These issues can occur anywhere, so we rely on your communication to tackle these issues.

Keeping Our Community Safe

Welcome to the latest update from your NR32 Melton Town North Beat Team. Over the past few weeks we've been out across the beat tackling the issues that matter most to our communities, from road safety and anti-social behaviour to engaging with local schools and supporting victims of crime.

Beat Surgeries & Community Engagement

PCSO Fen 6193 recently returned to the Melton Town North Beat and held a successful Beat Surgery at Hill Top Farm alongside PC 1596 Ellis and PC 1744 Preston. The event gave local residents the opportunity to discuss concerns, ask questions, and receive updates on current policing activity.

Thank you to everyone who came along to speak with us. These conversations help us understand what matters most to our communities and shape our patrols and priorities.

Road Safety Remains a Priority

Following ongoing concerns from residents about driving standards, officers have continued proactive enforcement across the beat.

High-visibility patrols have taken place on Pork Pie Way, where speeding continues to be a concern despite clear speed limit signage. Both marked and unmarked patrols have also been used to identify dangerous driving and challenge motorists who ignore the rules of the road.

Officers have also been focusing on seatbelt offences, reminding drivers that wearing a seatbelt is not only a legal requirement but one of the simplest ways to save lives.

In addition, during recent night shifts, PC 2170 and PC 1045 stopped a driver who was arrested and later charged with drink driving. Removing dangerous drivers from our roads remains a key priority, and we will continue to take robust action against anyone who puts others at risk.

Tackling Anti-Social Behaviour

Anti-social behaviour continues to be one of the team's main priorities.

Reports from residents and businesses are helping officers identify those responsible, build intelligence, and direct patrols to the areas where they are needed most. We continue to work closely with partner agencies, using a range of interventions and enforcement powers to tackle persistent issues and improve the quality of life for everyone living and working in Melton Town North.

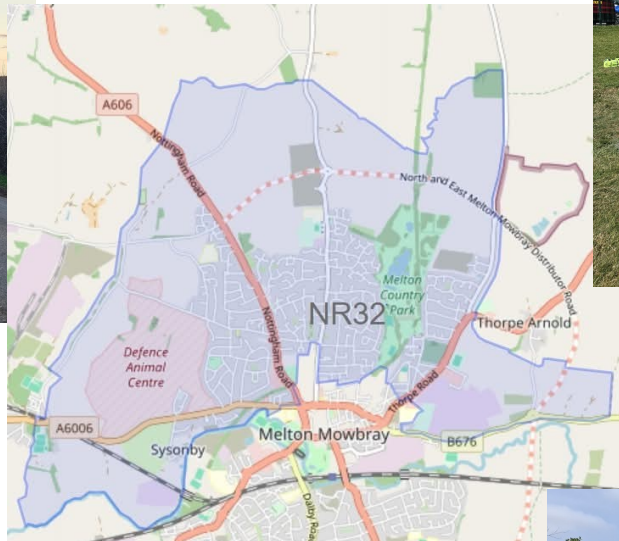
It was fantastic to see so much enthusiasm from both the pupils and their families. We would like to thank everyone involved in organising the event and hope to return again next year.
