News

The local beat team have had quite a few reports of Anti social behaviour involving bikes in the area of Enderby near to Mill lane, Barr close and the Golf course. These bikes have been causing damage to a lot of the green spaces in the area and are a cause of concern to many local residents . The beat team have created a report and are collating local CCTV footage and have been patrolling the areas the bikes have been spotted. We have identified a bike and rider and will be visiting to give a warning letter and a section 59. We will keep monitoring the issues of bikes and this will remain a priority on the beat.

A prolific shoplifter who committed more than 30 thefts from shops at a retail park in Leicester has been jailed. Lewis Foulds, 33, of no fixed address, appeared at Leicester Crown Court on Tuesday 26 January where he was sentenced to 16 months in prison and issued with a seven-year restraining order. The order prohibits Foulds from going within 100 metres of Asda Filling Station at Fosse Park, Sainsburys Superstore and Sainsburys Petrol Station at Grove Triangle and Tesco Petrol Station on Narborough Road. He was sentenced for 37 counts of theft and a further 36 counts where he breached a Criminal Behaviour Order (CBO), previously issued by the courts. He was also sentenced for common assault and public order. The offences were committed between June and October last year at various stores at Fosse Park Shopping Centre, Leicester. Sergeant Aaron Biggs said: "Foulds is a prolific offender who has committed numerous offences and then breached the conditions of his CBO, again on several occasions. We are pleased that the courts have taken this seriously and assisted us further by issuing a restraining order. We hope his time in prison will now give him an opportunity to mend his ways or face further prosecution."

Operation Detect was launched by Hinckley and Blaby Neighbourhood Policing Area (NPA) in response to your feedback [#YouSaidWeDid](#). The Op focuses on targeting spree offenders and reducing repeat offending. More than 290 suspects were dealt with for shoplifting offences in the last year in the Hinckley and Blaby area. Since the Op began, the team have been responsible for detecting over 1,200 crimes and more than 100 prisoners have been remanded. In 2025 the team were runners up at the National Acquisitive Crime awards in the category "Most innovative acquisitive crime reduction project award." We want to encourage any stores to report thefts to us so we can focus on the areas being worse hit.
