Our beat priorities continue to be:

Priority 1: ASB. What we are going to do: The beat team aim to tackle incidences of ASB within the villages including the parks and beauty spots of Charnwood West utilising ASB and civil legislation and patrols in locations identified as subject to ASB.

Priority 2: Speeding and Road safety. What we are going to do: The beat team will deal with issues of road safety and speeding in Charnwood West villages. If you believe that there is an issue in your area, let the beat team know.

Priority 3: Drugs. What we are going to do: The beat team will deal with incidences of drug use and dealing across the beat area. Patrolling identified areas, utilising stop search powers where available and develop intelligence to allow us to target dealing within your area.

The Charnwood West Dedicated Neighbourhood Team have been working throughout January to tackle our chosen priorities of Speeding and Road Traffic Safety, Anti Social Behaviour and Drugs (including use and drug dealing).

All the team featuring Sergeant Adkin, PC Nicholson, PCSO Martin and PCSO Colley have been working both out on the beat engaging with the community, and completing essential behind the scenes administrative work on the below and other aspects of policing:

Drugs and Drug Dealing

Throughout March, the NL56 Charnwood West Beat Team has continued proactive work to tackle drug-related activity within our local communities. Following concerns raised by a property owner, officers have discovered and disposed of a cannabis grow at a residential address in Rothley earlier this month. To deter further activity officers have been conducting frequent high-visibility patrols on foot, in marked units, and in unmarked/plain-clothes vehicles across areas previously linked to drug use and supply, including Quorn, Rothley, Swithland, and Woodhouse Eaves. These patrols aim to deter, disrupt, and intervene with drug-related behaviour whenever it is identified. We continue to gather and develop intelligence around individuals and locations of concern. This information is feeding into ongoing investigations and targeted enforcement, supported jointly with the Neighbourhood Priority Team. Our ongoing focus is to identify properties and hotspots associated with drug-related activity, reduce harm, and keep our communities safe. Residents remain a vital part of this work. If you notice anything suspicious such as unfamiliar visitors, activity at unusual hours, or strong, distinctive smells linked to drug cultivation or use please report it. You can contact us directly via the Leicestershire Police website or report anonymously through Crimestoppers. Every piece of information helps build a clearer picture and supports our efforts to tackle illegal drug activity. Thank you for your continued support in helping keep our communities safe.

Anti-Social Behaviour

Throughout March, the NL56 Charnwood West Beat Team has continued to prioritise reducing anti-social behaviour (ASB) across our villages. We have remained in close contact with local schools, working together to identify emerging concerns and support early intervention with young people. Routine patrols have taken place across all villages, including key ASB hotspots reported by residents. These patrols help provide visibility, reassurance, and allow officers to take early action where necessary. Officers have also continued to visit victims of ASB, offering support, guidance, and signposting to additional services where appropriate. The Beat Team remains committed to working closely with partners and our wider community to address ASB and ensure our area remains a safe and welcoming place to live. The beat team have conducted joint agency patchwalks/meetings with Charnwood Borough Council regarding properties in Quorn, Rothley and Woodhouse Eaves. A community resolution has also been issued at an address in Quorn and other addresses are on the incremental approach of the ASB process. If you witness or experience anti-social behaviour, please report it via 101, through the Leicestershire Police website, or by contacting your local beat team. Every report helps us respond effectively and understand where support is most needed.

Speeding and Road Traffic Safety

Throughout March, the NL56 Charnwood West Beat Team has continued to address speeding concerns raised by residents across our local villages. This month, PS 362 Adkin, PC 1574 Nicholson and PCSO 6144 Martin conducted targeted speed operations at two community highlighted locations: Mountsorrel Lane in Rothley and Brand Hill in Woodhouse Eaves. We are pleased to report that at both locations most drivers were adhering to the speed limit. No tickets were issued, and only one driver at each site received a verbal warning for a slight breach of the limit. This positive level of compliance is reassuring and reflects the continued efforts of local residents to promote safe driving behaviour. Members of the team will also be attending a joint agency Road Safety meeting this month alongside residents in an effort to support our communities and raise concerns. Speeding remains a key community safety concern, especially in residential areas, near schools, and on rural roads where hazards can appear with little warning. Slower speeds help ensure drivers have more time to react and reduce both the likelihood and severity of collisions. The Beat Team will continue to carry out speed checks where possible and maintain a visible presence in areas highlighted by residents. Additionally, PC Amelia will be attending the next Charnwood Road Safety Meeting to raise the community's concerns and support wider discussions around improving road safety across the area. We are grateful for the continued support from residents in reporting speeding issues. Your information enables us to target activity effectively and helps keep our villages safe.
