Priority 1:

Action taken:

Police have asked you!

Coalville Beat team have asked the resident of the area through social media and Neighbourhood Link where in Coalville do people have problem with speeding.

An Increase in speeding operations will be planned.

Priority 2:

Shop Thefts in Belvoir Shopping Centre and local area.

Action Taken:

Local beat officers are meeting with the Council, management and security of Belvoir Shopping Centre to work jointly in reducing thefts across the local shops. Police are devising a 'Shop Watch' Scheme in order to tackle and reduce thefts.

Patrols and local operations will continue at the location

Priority 3:

Drugs and ASB Activity in Coalville, which have been identified to specific streets and addresses

Action taken:

Drug warrants have been completed at a number of addresses following information and intelligence received from the community. We will continue to work with partner agencies and action will be taken where appropriate.

APPEAL - CCTV image issued after two bikes stolen from Coalville

Officers are appealing for information regarding the whereabouts of two bikes stolen in a Coalville burglary.

Sometime between 1am and 2am on Monday 4 December a business premises in Ashby Road was broken into.

Stolen from inside were two specialised mountain bikes – a silver and black Giant Trinity Tri bike and a Giant TCR Advanced Pro 2021.

Also stolen was a number of bike items such as saddles and tyres as well as a laptop.

PC Tom Leeks is investigating the burglary.

He said: “These bikes are of a substantial value and their loss as expected, we will have a significant negative impact on the business.

“As part of our investigation, we have released an image of a man we wish to identify.

“If you have any information about who he is, or where these stolen bikes are, please contact us.”

NEIGHBOURHOOD LINK:

Neighbourhood Link community messaging service

Neighbourhood Link is a community messaging service from Leicestershire Police that provides news and information about policing activity or initiatives, crime prevention advice as well as major incidents affecting your area.

Through this service you can receive messages from your local Neighbourhood Policing Team, local police or, in the event of a major incident or event affecting the whole of Leicestershire, from a partnership of agencies known as the Local Resilience Forum (LRF).

In order to receive messages you will need to register your details. This information will enable us to send you messages relevant to the areas you live and work. Anyone can register, whether you live, work or travel into Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland. Registration is free and simple to follow.

Once you have registered you will receive messages via email unless you have specified otherwise. On some occasions it may be appropriate for messages to be sent via text messages or voicemail.

- If you are already registered you can amend your details
- Request a reminder if you have forgotten your username or password
- You can unsubscribe from the service at any time

Neighbourhood Link is not able to receive messages and you should not use it to contact the police. In an emergency always dial 999. An emergency is when a crime is happening, someone suspected of a crime is nearby, someone is injured, being threatened or in danger.

If you wish to contact Leicestershire Police in other circumstances, for example to speak to local police or seek advice on police matters, you can call us by dialling 101 on your telephone.
