Our beat priorities continue to be:

Priority 1: ASB. What we are going to do: The beat team aim to tackle incidences of ASB within the villages including the parks and beauty spots of Charnwood West utilising ASB and civil legislation and patrols in locations identified as subject to ASB.

Priority 2: Speeding and Road safety. What we are going to do: The beat team will deal with issues of road safety and speeding in Charnwood West villages. If you believe that there is an issue in your area, let the beat team know.

Priority 3: Drugs. What we are going to do: The beat team will deal with incidences of drug use and dealing across the beat area. Patrolling identified areas, utilising stop search powers where available and develop intelligence to allow us to target dealing within your area.

The Charnwood West Dedicated Neighbourhood Team have been working throughout January to tackle our chosen priorities of Speeding and Road Traffic Safety, Anti Social Behaviour and Drugs (including use and drug dealing).

All the team featuring Sergeant Adkin, PC Nicholson, PCSO Martin and PCSO Colley have been working both out on the beat engaging with the community, and completing essential behind the scenes administrative work on the below and other aspects of policing:

Drugs and Drug Dealing

Throughout June, the NL56 Charnwood West Beat Team has continued to tackle drug-related concerns across the neighbourhood. Officers have carried out a mix of patrols, including high-visibility and un-marked deployments, in areas such as Quorn, Rothley, Swithland and Woodhouse Eaves to disrupt activity and deter offending. Intelligence gathering remains a key focus, supporting targeted work with specialist teams to identify individuals and locations linked to drug use and supply. Welfare visits were also carried out at addresses in Quorn in relation to suspected drug use, with occupants referred to appropriate support services.

We continue to encourage residents to report any concerns, as community information plays a vital role in helping us keep our areas safe.

Anti-Social Behaviour

Throughout June, the NL56 Charnwood West Beat Team has continued to tackle anti-social behaviour (ASB) across local villages. Officers have carried out regular high-visibility patrols, focusing on areas identified by residents including Kinchley Lane, while maintaining strong links with local schools to address emerging issues among young people. Follow-up visits have also been conducted in Rothley, Quorn and Woodhouse Eaves, providing support to victims and issuing advice and warning letters where appropriate to those identified as being involved in ASB following the incremental approach. The team remains committed to working with partner agencies to reduce ASB and support the community.

Speeding and Road Traffic Safety

During June, speed enforcement activity continued across the NL56 area. A targeted speed operation was carried out in Swithland on 13 June, during which two motorists were issued tickets for exceeding the 30mph limit one travelling at 40mph and another at 46mph.

We will continue to monitor speeds and take action where necessary to help keep our roads safe.
