What matters to you

From data collated from local surveys, beat knowledge, intelligence and reports made to Leicestershire Police, the following have been highlighted as priorities within the community.

Priority 1: Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB).

You said: General ASB is still an issue and continues across the beat.

We did: ASB across the beat has declined in the previous month but there have still been some reports, significant time has been spent conducting visible patrols and engagement with the community in an effort to deter issues. There has been a focus on open space areas and the Saffron Lane estate and we will continue to work with partner agencies to address and tackle any emerging or persisting ASB reports.

Priority 2: Drug use and supply.

You said: Drug dealing, taking and cultivation is still happening in the local community.

We continue to progress reports of drug use and supply across the beat and patrols have been conducted in hotspot areas. Work is ongoing to identify any locations that may be used to cultivate drugs, if you suspect an address is being used as a possible grow then please report it to us.

Priority 3: Specific ASB.

You said: That there is ASB around Knighton Lane East including open space areas in the surrounding area.

We did: Patrols in this location have still continued but gladly as the same as last month issues in this area have again declined. The Safer Winter Streets initiative has a high focus in this location, recently a vehicle was seized in the Knighton Lane East area after the vehicle was found to have been declared SORN but was being driven on the road.

PCSO's Spencer and Michelle spent time with the local parks rangers earlier this month, long serving Andy and his new student Erik met with the local team to discuss issues and ways to better open space areas on the beat including both recreation grounds and the wash brook nature reserve. Topics such as cleanliness, access and safety in these areas were addressed all in an effort to better these locations for the wider community.

The Safer Winter Streets initiative has been in operation since the beginning of December gaining positive results. The campaign aims at tackling retail crime, ASB and building better community ties by increasing police visibility. Locally there has been several E-Scooters/modified E-Bikes seized and a prolific shop lifter was recently arrested. Safer Winter Streets will continue until the end of January 2026, so please if you do see officers out and about please raise any issues or concerns with them.

As this will be the last newsletter published before the start of 2026, the local team would like to wish everyone a happy new year. We hope you enjoy the celebrations safely and sensibly and thank you to everyone in the community for their continued support.
