Burglaries including residential and commercial property.	Active patrols are conducted around the beat. As of 18/05 over the past 30 days we have had 0 reported burglaries.
General anti-social behaviour, congregating children causing issues and asb involving e-bikes and e-scooters motorbikes	Reports received of youths riding on 5 motorbikes around the Countesthorpe Country Park. Officers attended and body worn video was taken. Foot patrol's in the area will continue whilst we try to identify the perpetrators.
Issues reported of people dealing drugs within our area.	PC Jodie is developing intelligence in relation to information received regarding drug dealing from an address.

Shop keepers beware! We have had two reports received in the last week of counterfeit notes being used to pay for items. CCTV enquiries have been conducted and we have received intelligence regarding a possible suspect.

A report was received about a car that was damaged and hazardous to the public, it was located in a carpark. We reported this to Platform Housing and they were organising the vehicle to be removed as it sits on private land.

Regarding the fishing issue at Countesthorpe Park. We have been working with the Fisheries department. We had originally caught the children on their way into the park with their fishing rods and buckets and asked them not to fish, to ensure that the fish and themselves kept safe. A week later, adults came and set up a tent, fished, littered and set a fire. The Fisheries department have advised that adults can be prosecuted for this. As I hear further information, I will let you know.



Police and Crime Commissioner Rupert Matthews joined PCSO Kirsty from Blaby Police for a multi-agency patchwalk in Countesthorpe. Colleagues from East Midlands Homes and Leicestershire County Council also took part, bringing partners together to support the local area. During the visit, the PCC heard about ongoing work by PCSO Reid and PC Jodie to support the community, spoke with local residents, and visited businesses to hear directly about their experiences. Great to see continued partnership working from the local beat team and partners to make a positive difference in the area.
