# **#YouSaidWeDid - What matters to you**

You said that the following three priorities matter to you. Due to this, we have taken proportionate steps to target harden, educate and tackle the following priorities.

<u>Priority 1)</u> To reduce anti-social behaviour involving young people in Kegworth, specifically in response to a recent spike in incident reports.

Actions Taken) 8 Youths have been identified as being involved in ASB within Kegworth. 4 of the youths have/ or are in the process of being interviewed due to evidence identified. The incremental approach has began with all involved and ABC contracts are being considered to support the desistance of crime. A problem management plan has been created to manage the individuals involved with the support from external agencies to tackle the issue at hand.

<u>Priority 2)</u> To reduce serious and acquisitive crime across the Valley Beat by utilising a range of tactical options including prevention, investigative support and victim / witness care.

Action Taken) Within April, we have focussed on prevention and target hardening to reduce serious and acquisitive crime. We have conducted house to house visits and have attended local events to educate residents on home and vehicle security. We have also focussed efforts on identifying suspects involved in burglaries. We have also provided support to victims of crime to help them recover from the trauma of being a victim of serious and acquisitive crime.

Priority 3) To deal with vehicle related ASB in the vicinity of Diseworth Road, Castle Donington.

<u>Action Taken</u>). To address vehicle-related ASB we have taken several measures. These include increased patrols to show an obvious and visible presence, we have asked people to move away from the area that were suspected of being involved in ASB and have ensured that suitable warning signs are in place which act as a first and only warning.

## Continued Efforts to Tackle Car Cruise related ASB...



April has been a busy month for officers tackling car cruise related matters. We have received numerous reports and have been able to gather valuable intelligence which may identify those in charge of private organised meets. We have also identified approximately 40 vehicles that were in breach of the PSPO (Public Space Protection Order). We expect that the council, the owners of the PSPO, will be issuing £100 fines in due course.

The utilisation of the advanced speed gun technology (pictured left) has also proved very useful over the last couple of deployments. The recording feature is certainly proving very useful.

Our teamwork with the local business SEGRO is also proving extremely useful. We have an extra set of eyes and ears with use of their fantastic CCTV system.
