#YouSaid - What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will prioritise the following for the upcoming July 2025.

Priority 1: Drug offences.

You said: Issues raised specifically about drug taking and drug dealing within the area have been raised to us.

What we are going to do: Respond to concerns/communication from residents whereby we will aim to target the hotspot areas that this has been reported to us and the reported times. If you wish to make us aware of further hotspots and times that these activities are taking place then please let us know so that we can deter this behaviour and act on it for you to better your confidence in your community. Vehicles that we suspect to be involved in dealing or drug use through our intelligence logs presented by our community will be challenged and stopped.

Priority 2: Road Safety Concerns

You Said: Local concerns show us that you have raised speeding as the next priority within the area.

What we are going to do: This upcoming month officers are going to conduct speed checks within the area to deter speeding and also provide the relevant outcome to people who have raised this as an issue to us. Section 59 warnings have been given to those people who have used their vehicle antisocially within the Wigston area this month, and officers aim to maintain the use of these Section 59's on vehicles throughout the future.

Priority 3: Vehicle Crime

You Said: Concerns were raised to us this month in relation to theft from motor vehicles and theft of motor vehicles.

What we are going to do: Support residents on the ways in which they can keep their vehicles secure, more specifically those that are keyless as these are progressively becoming more targeted. In relation to theft from motor vehicle, officers are heading out to challenge those and educate them on the importance on not leaving valuables in the car, particularly those that leave them on display or those that leave their work kit in their work vehicles.

#WeDid - What we are doing

A vehicle has been seized this month after checks showed that there was vehicles driving without any TAX. Please take this as your reminder to check when your TAX, MOT and insurance is all in place. Further to this, our Harborough officers conducted a night patrol to target some of the anti-social behaviour in relation to vehicles. This saw them stopping vehicles for suspicious behaviour and loud exhausts, several drivers breathalysed, intelligence gathering was conducted and a vehicle seized for incorrect documents.

Glenmere Primary school hosted a summer fete this month which officers attended to connect with the community. This was particularly great for the younger generation to see the police car and have a positive interaction with the police and build a rapport for when they see us on patrols out and about in their community.

After reports of a vulnerable male missing from home, our Wigston PCSO's headed out and found the missing child and ensured that he was safeguarded and returned home with all the appropriate care in place.

This month there have been arrests made as part of our Op Detect, which solely focuses on shop thefts. This has had a result of 11 charges made against brothers in the Wigston area that target stores. The courts and stores are now working closely together to secure a CBO for them.

Proactive patrols by officers have been completed by officers in the areas that have been reported to have antisocial behaviour to us by residents. This has included patrols around the Wigston Meadows whereby we have had reports of off road bikes and mopeds riding around. A vehicle that had been abandoned after being used anti-socially was seized and taken by officers and the suspect was dealt with accordingly by officers.

Vehicles that have been used in crime and or/stolen have been taken off of the road, as well as many vehicles that do not have appropriate documentation, Tax, MOT and insurance.

Officers have attended road traffic accidents to assist with road closures when there have been road accidents to ensure that people can proceed safely and those that are working on the scene of the road closures can work safely to provide the best outcome for individuals.

Visits have been made to check the welfare of vulnerable residents in the area and referrals made to ensure that the most appropriate agency
