#YouSaid - What matters to you

Below are our new beat priorities for July 2025, set by our surveys-

Priority -

Tackling concerns around acquisitive crimes on the ward, including burglary, damage to and theft from motor vehicles, and theft from person offences, particularly in the Newfoundpool, Tudor Road areas and on The Rally park.

Priority -

Dealing with the production of class B drugs on the area, in addition to tackling the use and supply of both class A and B drugs in areas where this affects the local community.

Priority -

Targeting alcohol fuelled ASB on the ward with a focus on street drinking and youth ASB in open spaces such as The Rally, Glenfield Road East and Hinckley Road near the junction with Kirby Road.

Welcome to the June edition of the Fosse neighbourhood newsletter.

Firstly, we would like to welcome Sam, a PC from the Response team for West Leicester who is on a 6 month attachment with us. I'm sure he will settle into the team well so if you see him about please help make him feel welcome.

This month our officers continue with welfare visits to those most vulnerable known to us on the beat. These visits have involved those who are an easier target to be coerced into criminal activity. There are five beats covering West Leicester, and as well as having our own priorities we all help each other too. Therefore, our PC's have assisted with welfare visits on our neighbouring heats also

During these visits, a male has subsequently been arrested for assault and harassment. One of our vulnerable residents was found with facial injuries and it came to light that a male staying with him was intimidating this male into buying drugs for him. Daily visits have been put in place with the victim to check on his welfare.

Over the past few weeks there have been numerous arrests in connection to robberies and bike thefts. This is force wide. We've managed to recover a couple of these stolen bikes and their owners informed.

There has been a rise in mobile phone thefts on the beat so please be mindful. Unfortunately, there have been cases especially on the Rally park whereby these mobile phones have been snatched from people's hands and many of those committing these offences are speedily making off on bikes and scooters. So please take care and be aware of your surroundings, where you are and how you are using your phone.

We continue to heavily patrol the beat whether it be on foot or in a marked police car. Those areas most effected that you see within our priorities are having extra patrols and where opportunities arise, parking up on the Rally park to help try an deter criminal activity, and engaging with youths in the area known to cause ASB.

We have a handful of beat surgeries being carried out through July, these are listed below. So if you get the opportunity and would like to make us aware of anything then please come along and speak to one of the team.
