PC Jon and PCSO Duane have been in attendance at St Crispin's church and Braunstone Town Civic Centre for opportunities to meet vulnerable members of the public. This was particularly useful in light of the murder trial reaching conclusion that saw two juveniles convicted of manslaughter.

PCSO Duane visited Kingsway Primary School this month and spoke with the Year 6 children about being safe online, especially where it concerns bullying and passwords. A very attentive year group with plenty of

questions. Hopefully this will help them keeping safe online in the future. We then visited the Dorothy Goodman School based at Ravenhurst Primary School. The children there had great fun seeing the police car and talking about the Police.

PC Jon had a meeting at the Co op on Turnbull drive to review store thefts still under investigation and is pleased to report a significant decrease in thefts due to the collaborative working between police and staff.

Whilst on patrol of Braunstone town it was nice to speak with so many people wanting to stop and chat. These were both old and young (being Easter hols). Our travels took us along down Kingsway to support the local community with ASB and neighbour issues. We patrolled Franklin park before speaking with other residents on Ayston Road as I am investigating some ASB there so I will be monitoring developments.
