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KEEP SAFE PLACES AVAILABLE



Across Hinckley & Bosworth there are Keep Safe Places that are available to residents who offer support and advice to anyone feeling overwhelmed, vulnerable or distressed.

Stickers with the Keep Safe Place logo can be seen on the door or window of venues which include libraries, shops, cafés, Hinckley Hub, Hinckley leisure centre, community centres, disability services and churches that have signed up to the scheme. Staff at these venues can support by contacting friends, family or the emergency services if needed.

For some people, knowing there's a place of security close by can provide the confidence to go out freely. The community safety team and libraries provide Keep Safe cards which show the details of who to contact in an emergency, or medical assistance that may be needed. Keep Safe Places is a local partnership scheme within Leicestershire which Hinckley & Bosworth Community Safety Partnership is a part of.

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A WELCOME SPACE TO SUPPORT RESIDENTS

The borough Council's community houses operated as 'centres for warmth' to those who are struggling with the cost of living thanks to funding from Cadent. The centres based in Barwell, Earl Shilton, Wykin and Burbage will extend the offer of services available as well as providing opportunities to take some of the expanded services out into communities across the borough. At each centre welfare support officers work directly with residents who need support. The funding will continue to provide support with money management, energy advice, 'cooking on a budget class', carbon monoxide awareness sessions with free access to alarms, home energy efficiency advice and free gas safety checks. A community development worker has been funded who will provide six slow cooker sessions at the family and toddler group at the George Ward Centre in Barwell, showing families how to make delicious healthy food in simple and budget friendly ways.

Executive member for Community Safety and Housing, Cllr Michael Mullaney said: "Thanks to the generosity of Cadent, we can extend the services we can offer and we hope that it will help many more residents in need. With

the expansion of our welfare support team, the borough council has already been able to support over 600 cases this year so far."


PREMIER KICKS

This diversionary activity for young people has been delivered within the borough for a number of years and continues to provide support for young people to socialise in a safe environment, to learn new skills and play football. Delivered by Leicester City in the Community the project provides a consistent place for young people to take part in safe and physical activities after school in their community.

Supported by the Police and Crime Commissioner Partnership Locality Funds the project is held at Green Towers Club 4 Young people, the project works in partnership with the local beat team for young people aged between 11-15 in term-time only and has been an effective tool for breaking down barriers between young people and the police.

Working across two pitches once a week the team have engaged with young people during this year with a group of upwards to 30 persons regularly participating each week.

A pilot project was held in September 2023 which successfully engaged with 28 young people at Heath Lane Academy which was organised in response to anti-social behaviour. During February, further funding from the Partnership Locality funds enabled a further 4-week programme to take place with more than 30 young people, which culminated in a fixture between Hinckley and Heath Lane. SCHOOL WORKSHOPS

Since the start of this year the community safety team along with staff from cultural services, and partners from Leicestershire Fire & Rescue service, Leicestershire Police and Turning Point have continued to deliver a range of workshops and events to primary and secondary schools across the borough.

Workshops range from ASB Busters, healthy relationships, vulnerability and exploitation, health and wellbeing to safer driving events and healthy holiday sessions.

Recently the team attended The Hinckley School and delivered a healthy holiday session about keeping safe over the summer to Yr 12 sixth form students about alcohol, anti-social behaviour, BBQ safety, water safety, wellbeing and healthy relationships which students were able to get involved in by trying out the many resources such as the beer goggles and measuring out alcohol units.







STREETVIBE


Streetvive Young People's service over the past year has provided youth work in the Argents Mead area of Hinckley twice a week, building positive relationships with young people. The youth bus is a safe and engaging space where young people can get involved with activities as well as a supportive environment for addressing personal issues.

72 bus sessions have been delivered and seven detached outreach sessions, engaging with 1322 young people.



Supported by the Police and Crime Commissioner Partnership Locality Funds this has enabled Streetvibe to identify and support young people at risk of disengagement and isolation through targeted interventions.

Laura Hill, Streetvibe manager said: "By actively engaging young people in meaningful activities, the outreach facilities work prevent disengagement from school, work and social networks. This proactive approach helps keep young people on a positive trajectory and reduces the likelihood of them becoming involved in anti-social behaviour".



DOMESTIC ABUSE OUTREACH SERVICE UPDATE

The Domestic Abuse Outreach Service continue to offer ongoing 1-1 support and group-based support to survivors of Domestic Abuse.

The service has delivered the following groups –

The Freedom Programme - September to December 2023, and January to March 2024
The Recovery Toolkit – September to December 2023, and January to March 2024
The Unbreakable Course - June to July 2023 and February to March 2024.
The Healing Together Programme (Adult & Child) - October 2023 to November 2023 and April to May 2024.

Survivors comments have been extremely positive from the groups –

"Thank you for this programme, it has enabled me to make sense of all that has been in my past and to empower me to avoid things in the future".

"The best thing about the group was meeting people who have experienced the same things as me."

"It's enabled me to answer many questions and see how to avoid behaviours."

"It was better then expected. I learnt a lot about myself and found new ways to improve both myself and my life."

"The group was amazing, informative, challenging but having a safe place to be able to process all of my emotions in a healthy way."

"The group was something we can do together and can talk about what we have learnt. I heard new techniques that I could do with my son".

Alongside the 1-1 and group-base support, the Domestic Abuse Outreach Service have been able to offer awareness sessions between September 2023 and March 2024 with partner agencies on relevant subjects such as:

- Domestic Abuse and Homelessness
- How children are impacted by Domestic Abuse, this included sharing the new legislation regarding children to be classed as victims, and Adverse Childhood Experience's (ACE's)
- Coercive control within relationships
- Economic abuse within an abusive relationship

These sessions were well received by staff members and partner agencies.

The fire service continues to support survivors through our service – offering a fire safety check in every home, which gives survivors extra reassurance to feel safer in their own homes.

The service was very excited to be able exhibit artwork by our service user group, "Behind Closed Doors" depicting their interpretation of "My Recovery from Trauma". This has also been displayed across the borough in different venues. Feedback from members of the public for this artwork was incredibly positive.

Every November we support the White Ribbon Campaign (which begins on 25th November every year).

The service held an event at the Hinckley Hub in November 2023 where professionals were able to network together, share knowledge and promote services available for survivors of DA within Blaby & Hinckley & Bosworth.

Around 40 services attended the event, and it was fantastic to see collaborative working to support survivors within our borough.
