Drug offences including drug taking and drug dealing	We are currently developing intelligence we have received in relation to drug dealing from a property on the beat.
Road safety including Speeding, obstructing the highway, speeding and parking	We received reports of around 15 cars speeding and racing. The caller stated that one of them nearly collided with her vehicle when she was on her way home from work. One vehicle was stopped due to clocking over 100mph. The driver was issued with a ticket and had only been driving for 4 months.
