#YouSaid - What matters to you

We have listened to your concerns and prioritised the following in March 2025: **Priority 1: Anti-social Behaviour**


- You Said: Reports of anti-social behaviour around "The Black Path" include youths throwing items at houses and knocking on doors.
- **Our Action:** Patrols were conducted by the beat team on the Beaumont Walk area. During the month of March we seen a reduction in the amount of calls. We have a few specific houses we have conducted joint visit with Housing ASB officers and advised friend on motorbikes associating with their address could affect their tenacy agreement. We will continue our preventative patrols in the area throughout April.

Priority 2: Retail Shop Thefts

- You Said: Retailers and security at the Beaumont Leys Shopping Centre continue to report a significant increase in shoplifting and threats against store staff.
- **Our Action:** A Problem Management Plan has been established. We will collaborate with retail stores and security personnel to address the offenders. Crime prevention patrols are being conducted by both uniformed and plain-clothed officers.

Priority 3: Thefts from Motor Vehicles

- You Said: Addressing the increase in thefts from motor vehicles, particularly at Heathley Park. Light commercial vehicles are being specifically targeted for tools left inside overnight.
- **Our Action:** The Beat team is working with local businesses in the area to locate weaknesses and prioritise our patrols to strengthen them areas. We have seen a reduction in theft from vehicles in the area, however we plan to continue through April.

Patrols in and around Upper Temple Walk and Beaumont Walk due to rise in Anti-Social Behaviour.

- The local neighbourhood team has been busy this March with patrols, covering response, beat engagement events, assisting with scenes and helping out with CCTV enquiries.
- A local youth that was causing damage at the Beaumont Shopping Centre has been issued with a community resolution. He was referred to and now engaged with the council youth team to get provisions to divert him away from ASB.
- PCSO Kurtis, Telat and Jaik have been linking in with the local ASB officers from PA housing, Sage Homes and Leicester city council to tackle multiple on-going antisocial behaviour reports. A joint visit has taken place for off-road motorbikes which for the last 2 weeks has reduced the behaviour.
- PC Sam, Sam and Tony found a man wanted for failing to attend court for offences involving drugs. He was located in a house without a door handle. Officers unsure what taking the door handle achieved for him but wasted no time arresting him and taking him to court.
- The Beaumont neighbourhood team have continued this March with helping a neighbouring beat with enforcement of warrants and scene preservation.
- PCs Sam, Sam and Tony were first to response to reports of a prolific offender being in the Beaumont leys area. He was promptly arrested after being located sleeping rough in a block of flats. He was Remanded to court and due to being on recall will not be out for awhile.
