What matters to you

We have continued to listen to you and the concerns raised. Below has been identified as the main priorities for the beat area:

• Priority 1: Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)

You said: Anti-social behaviour is an issue in the Eyres Monsell area.

We did: As Halloween, Bonfire Night and Diwali draws closer we as a beat team are aware that there will be an increase in ASB (Anti Social Behaviour), we will therefore actively patrol our green spaces to ensure we are dispersing groups that may be causing issues.

Priority 2: Drug Dealing

You said: There is a problem with drug dealing on Eyres Monsell.

We did: We are aware of ongoing issues in regards to drugs namely dealing, using and other issues that come from drugs. We are dedicated in tackling those who cause harm in relation to drugs on the EME and welcome any information in regards to those causing these issues.

• Priority 3: Shop Thefts

You said: Shoplifting is an problem on the Eyres Monsell Estate.

We did: On the Eyres Monsell we have a large number of shops. Currently we are seeing a large amount of theft from stores which effects the wider community with shops upping prices to cover these lost items. We as a beat team are focused in bringing those to justice that create these issues.

Other News

This month the beat team have been completing proactive patrols in our hotspot areas for drugs to detect and disrupt these issues as they are one of our priorities on Eyres Monsell. These priorities are determined by what we are told by the residents of the area.

This month PC Alun came across a fire on Queens Park Way whilst he was out of foot patrol. Thanks to his quick actions and help from some of the local residents he was able to put out the fire before anyone was harmed.

Also this month the local team have been paying attention to the local Coop Stores on the area after a rise in thefts from the stores. We have been patrolling around the area as well as attending the stores to provide reassurance to the local residents as well as the staff.

PCSO Tay has been busy this month, earlier this month he visited Rolleston Primary School to chat with the students about the role of the Police and our work in the community. He also completed a patch walk on Eyres Monsell with the local councillor Elaine and Gary from the Parks department to the green spaces on the beat.
