What matters to you

We have revised our beat priorities as of July 2025 to reflect what we have been told concerns the community most.

- **Priority 1: ASB and Seasonal Crime—Victoria park.** We have had an escalation in reports of Vehicle Related ASB in Victoria Park's Car Park—The area will be a top priority for the beat team along with Traffic Police being involved. We will be supported by council CCTV located in the car park to identify offenders.
 - **What we did:** Throughout 2025, a number of Section 59 warnings, Traffic Offence Reports (TOR) and some seizures of vehicles have taken place. We will be persevering with this. **4** notices sent out in the last week of July
- **Priority 2: e-Scooters and e-Bikes** Ongoing concerns of e-scooters and bikes being ridden anti-socially in the Clarendon Park area.
 - **What we did:** To date; across Clarendon Park and neighbouring areas, an approx. 300 E-scooters and bikes have been seized. We will be continuing with Op. Pedalfast for the foreseeable.
- **Priority 3: Vehicle Crime** We will carry on with our initiatives to remind and re-educate about vehicle security over the summer months.
 - What we Did: Vehicles that appear to have been left in situ for some time have also been checked with the departure of students from the area. 2 thefts from vehicles in July

Other Local News

- **Bike Register**—PCSO Paul Williams will be hosting monthly Bike Marking events over the coming months. These venues will be advertised on Neighbourhood Link when they take place.
- **Queens Road**—Concerns have been raised about localised Shoplifting the Queens Road area—patrols will be increasing sporadically to deter/detect offenders.
- **Summer Events**—Many events are set to take place throughout the summer months, you will see officers at these events to ensure they are safe and enjoyable for everyone in attendance.
