#YouSaid - What matters to you

Below are our beat priorities -

Priority:

1. Dealing with anti-social behaviour and road safety involving the illegal use of e-scooters and e-bikes across the ward.

Action taken:

We Did: We continue to target antisocial behaviour connected to e-scooters and e-bikes where possible, using targeted patrols and stop checks. We suspect drug dealers are routinely using e-bikes to get around and are developing intelligence to identify them. Further Op Pedalfast events will be scheduled in to target the hotspots for this offending.

Priority:

2. Dealing with the production of class B drugs on the area, in addition to tackling the use and supply of both class A and B drugs in areas where this affects the local community.

Action taken:

We Did: In July we have conducted a number of stop searches on the beat connected to drugs, particularly in the Glenfield Road East area. This has resulted in one arrest so far, and more work in this area is planned. Our work around cannabis production continues with further enforcement in the planning stages.

Priority:

3. Reducing vehicle crime, including damage to, theft from and theft of motor vehicles on the beat.

Action taken (this relates to the previous priority around ASB):

We Did: In July we have seen a reduction in vehicle crime and damage. Patrols at key times continue to deter offending, and where vehicles are broken into, we are following all reasonable lines of enquiry to identify and deal with suspects. We have identified and dealt with two suspects for causing damage to vehicles on Bonchurch Street and are approaching the Youth Offending Service in relation to them.

This month has seen many of our Fosse officers deployed across the force area to cover a variety of enquiries, so not as much time as was planned on the beat.

July saw yet another national initiative, to be honest, there's been so many we can't remember what it was. However, rest assured it would have been something that we are already doing, and have been for awhile !!

The start of July saw an increase in the number of thefts from unoccupied vehicles. This resulted in a large number of police enquiries and patrols to deter. Reported crimes fell off and the end of the month saw a return to a low number of such cases. Please remember to lock your vehicle and remove any items which might attract a thief.

We can notify you of any particular trends in crime in your area through Neighbourhood Link. This is a free to use email service. If you wish to join it you can apply on line or ask a local officer to complete your application.

July, and into August, sees the Leicester Kickers in action on The Rally Park up until the week commencing 17th August 2026. The line up is:

In response to a growing number of concerns raised by the community, the Fosse Team are now beginning a concerted drive to deal with anti social behaviour, drug taking, street drinking and aggressive begging. This has spread over an area of the ward and tackling this is our priority. This is involving all the beat officers robustly engaging with the trouble makers and ensuring support is available to those who are vulnerable. Information from the public has assisted us in being able to target the worst areas and progress has been made.

We do rely on the public to report anything of concern, we cannot be everywhere at once in the community. So.....
