#YouSaid - What matters to you

Priority 1: Drug Dealing

You said: Issues re drug dealing in the local community.

What we are going to do: Patrols are taking place throughout the day and night and stop search powers are being utilised where grounds permit. Anyone found with illegal substances on them are being dealt with accordingly. Further patrols are also taking place throughout hot spot areas to build up intelligence that can be acted on. Please continue to report any suspicious activity to us.

Priority 2: Road Safety

You said: Speeding and road safety on the beat is a concern for you.

The beat team seized a car and the driver was dealt with by issuing a traffic offence report (TOR) for driving without insurance.

The Beat team also attended a RTC where by the driver was driving on a provisional licence and had two bold tyres. They will now be dealt with accordingly.

Priority 3: Anti-social Behaviour

It is now the School summer Holidays so extra patrols will take place to minimize anti social behaviour and general criminality.

You Said: Concerns raised relating to youth related Anti Social Behaviour.

What we are going to do: Support residents on an individual basis where complaints are made, challenge those involved and work with partner agencies to implement outcomes. Complete targeted patrols where identified to disrupt and challenge behaviour. These issues can occur anywhere, so we rely on your communication to tackle these issues.

NR32 Town North Beat Team Monthly Update

It has been another busy month for the NR32 Town North Beat Team, with officers responding to a wide range of incidents, conducting proactive patrols, and working closely with our communities to keep people safe.

Community Patrols and Incident Response

Throughout the month, PCSOs and officers have continued to maintain a visible presence across the beat through regular foot and vehicle patrols, engaging with residents, addressing concerns, and providing reassurance across our neighbourhoods.

PCSO Fen was involved in a variety of incidents, including helping to locate and recover a stolen telehandler that had been concealed within woodland, assisting with the search for a missing person, and attending several incidents where urgent medical aid was required. Support was also provided at a number of road traffic collisions, helping with road closures and traffic management to ensure the safety of motorists and emergency service personnel.

No two days are ever the same in neighbourhood policing, with officers also responding to reports of livestock on the road, assisting with the recovery of a double-decker bus, and continuing proactive patrols throughout the community.

Road Safety Operations

Road safety remains a key priority for the team.

PC Gill attended multiple traffic-related incidents throughout the month, including road traffic collisions and a significant road closure resulting from a burnt-out trailer carrying equipment for a festival. Officers spent several hours managing traffic and ensuring disruption was kept to a minimum while recovery work was completed safely.

The team also attended two road traffic collisions within the beat area, supporting emergency services and helping to maintain the safe flow of traffic while incidents were dealt with. We would like to thank members of the public for their patience during these incidents and remind all road users to drive safely, remain attentive, and be considerate of others.

Tackling Antisocial Vehicle Use

Following concerns raised by residents regarding the use of illegal e-scooters and e-bikes, proactive work has been undertaken by PC Gill, PC O'Rourke and colleagues. As a result, three illegal e-scooters were seized in a 24-hour period.

The team continues to make use of available powers to tackle antisocial vehicle use and respond directly to concerns raised by the community. Further enforcement activity is planned in the coming months as part of our ongoing commitment to improving road safety and reducing antisocial behaviour.



Supporting Vulnerable People

Officers have attended numerous concern-for-welfare incidents and domestic-related calls during the month. These incidents often require immediate attendance and involve safeguarding vulnerable individuals, carrying out risk assessments and working alongside partner agencies to ensure appropriate support is provided.

We would encourage residents to continue looking out for family members, friends and neighbours and to seek assistance if they have concerns about someone's welfare.

Community Information Leads to Positive Action

Information provided by local residents continues to play a vital role in helping us identify and address issues within our communities.

Following reports of a suspicious van, officers carried out enquiries and successfully located the vehicle. Checks revealed it had no valid MOT and had not been taxed since 2024. The vehicle was subsequently seized.

This successful outcome demonstrates how valuable community intelligence can be, and we would like to thank those who continue to report concerns and suspicious activity to us.

A Farewell for Now

This month also marks a change for the team as **PC 971 Gill** prepares to leave NR32 Town North for a temporary posting in **Oakham**.

During his time on the beat, PC Gill has been heavily involved in tackling community concerns, responding to incidents, supporting road safety operations, and taking proactive action against antisocial behaviour. His commitment to neighbourhood policing and the communities he serves has been greatly appreciated by both colleagues and residents alike.

While we are sorry to see him leave the team, we would like to thank him for all of his hard work, professionalism and dedication, and wish him every success in his new role. We know he will be a valuable asset to the Oakham community, and we look forward to welcoming him back in the future.
