The beat team are aware of some concerns about a knife and hammer being found on the Kirby Muxloe park close to the Primary School grounds. These objects have been taken safely from the area by police on Friday 1st thanks to great communication and work by the amazing staff over at Kirby Muxloe Primary School. Because of this, you will see more police presence around the area going forward. We understand that this may be alarming to some but please rest assured that this is not something that the beat team will take lightly and we are exploring ways on how we can combat any future incidents from occurring. Parents: please speak to your children about the risk of carrying dangerous items such as knives. It may be a tough conversation but it is a necessary one.

Reports came in of anti-social behaviour involving a group of cars on the A47. The vehicles later headed towards LFE, where we intercepted them and stopped two for their manner of driving. Police checks showed both drivers were known to police, and one was breaching a curfew by being out at that time. A report has been submitted to partner agencies regarding the breach, and intelligence has been passed to one of our proactive teams regarding the other driver.
